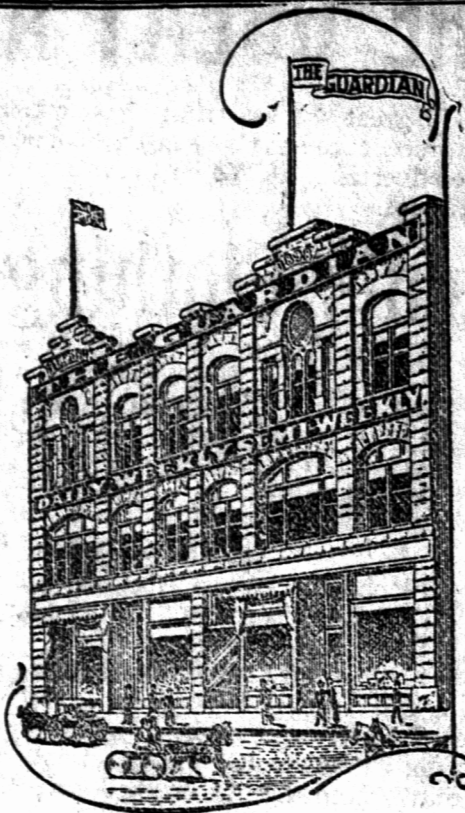

A BILLION BUSHELS.

This is the estimate which a travelling correspondent of the Buffalo News puts upon the possible future wheat crop of the Canadian Northwest. The News devotes a page to glowing descriptive matter and illustrations of what its correspondent saw while recently making a tour through our prairie wheat-fields. This correspondent finds that as yet only 3,189,000 acres in Manitoba, and 1,006,000 acres in the territories are under cultivation. He points out that the wheat belt consists of 290,823,040 acres, and of this 75,000,000 acres is good wheat land, divided as follows: Manitoba, 23,000,000; Assinibola, 19,000,000; Saskatchewan, 17,000,000; Alberta, 16,000,000 acres. The rest is an easy calculation. Seventy-five million acres at only 14 bushels to the acre will make over the billion bushels. Or two-thirds of that area—50 million acres—at twenty bushels to the acre would make up the billion. These are big figures, no doubt, but who shall say they are impossible of attainment?

And now it is given out that new gold fields have been discovered in the Transvaal equal in extent and value to the famous Witwatersrand. If true this will draw the world's attention afresh to that golden land. The Rand gold mines were for years before the late war the most productive in the world.

The Pacific cable connecting Canada and Australia will now soon be an accomplished fact. Australia and New Zealand have been connected and the cable has been laid as far as Fiji. The steamer Colonia is now on her way to Vancouver, and from that point, which is the terminus of the system, the cable will be carried to Fanning Island by the Colonia, while the steamer Anglia will join up the sections between Fanning Island and Fiji. Mr. Reynolds, the general manager of the cable, expects it to be in working order by November.

Premier Seddon of New Zealand, like Edward Blake, the late Alexander MacKenzie and George Brown is reported to have refused an offered title. In his case it was a baronetcy, and the title would have descended to his son, if he has one, and so on to his descendants in the male line. New Zealand is a very democratic country and it may be that its Premier felt that his personal popularity, which is great, would be impaired rather than enhanced by his acceptance of the proffered honor. With the growth of imperialistic feeling in Canada we seldom hear of a title being declined here in these days, although Governor Jones of Nova Scotia furnishes a rare exception.

Charles M. Schwab, the millionaire president of the Steel Trust, who is in receipt of a million dollars a year as salary, has broken down from overwork and has to give up his job and take a rest. He was once a poor boy and rose by diligence, energy and technical knowledge to a high position in the Carnegie works, and when the big trust was formed was recommended by Mr. Carnegie for the office of President. No doubt it is harder work to manage a billion dollar trust than to run a country store. Such a position involves a lot of thinking, and "thinking in millions" is harder work than thinking in plain ordinary dollars and cents.

While the farmers are deploring the growth of wild mustard there is another and worse crop growing in the cities and towns of Canada, spreading in the villages, too, and not wholly absent from the country districts. We refer to the crop of hoodlums—young, hectoring street rowdies, lounging, loafing, quarrelsome roughs. Unwittingly this crop is being cultivated here in Charlottetown and in other centres of population in various ways. Children of both sexes, lacking parental restraint, are allowed the free run of streets and alleys by day and night. They are permitted to absent themselves from school and spend their time in idleness and among bad companions. Thus the crop is sown. When it has a little larger growth, the cigarette, the dime novel and the beer bottle give it a further impetus. Soon we have the spitting corner loafer, habitually half full of drink and ready for any act of rowdiness. Pilfering and theft follow. Later the police court, the jail, the penitentiary and sometimes the gallows gathers in the harvest. It is a regular process, as sure and certain as the growth of wild mustard from the seed. Headless parent, where is your boy or girl at night? Are you, too, sowing seed for the hoodlum crop?
