ELECTION FIGURES

WORTH STUDYING NOW.

Votes in Greater New York are always interesting:

In 1906, Mr. Hearst for Governor in Greater New York polled 338,513.

In 1905, Mr. Hearst in Greater New York for Mayor polled 224,925.

When he ran for Governor, Mr. Hearst was the regular Democratic nominee.

When he ran for Mayor, Mr. Hearst, in 1905, was the Municipal Ownership nominee. There was no state election that year. There will be none this year. The total vote in state elections is always larger than in municipal elections.

A comparison is interesting:

GREATER NEW YORK.

Hearst, Dem., for governor, 1906.....338,513

Hearst, M. O., mayor, 1905.....224,925

Difference.....113,588

A comparison of Hearst's votes with others is also interesting, as what follows shows:

FOR GOVERNOR IN STATE.

Hearst, 1906.....673,268

Coler, 1902.....665,398

Hearst's state vote, 1906, over Coler, 1902.....7,870

Hughes, 1906.....749,002

Hearst, 1906.....673,268

Hughes over Hearst in state.....75,734

FOR GOVERNOR IN GREATER NEW YORK.

Hearst in 1906.....338,513

Hughes in 1906.....261,455

Coler in 1902.....327,132

Hearst over Coler.....11,381

Hearst over Hughes.....77,058

Thus, though Hughes beat Hearst in the state in 1906 by 75,734, the vote of Hearst even then was greater than that for Coler for Governor in 1902 by 7,870. And though Hearst in 1906 beat Hughes 77,058 in Greater New York, Hearst's vote even then was also 11,381 more than Coler's in Greater New York in 1902, and as Hearst was beaten in the state, and over-whelming as Coler's plurality two years before was in the city.

It should be borne in mind that "majorities" signify far less than total votes, says the Brooklyn Eagle. Total votes for a man should be studied. Large majorities in one special locality may be overcome by small majorities for the other man in many localities, as the case was in 1902.

REPORT OF C. P. R. DENIED.

LONDON, Oct 21—Montague Allan issues guarded denials to reports of Canadian Pacific acquiring the Allan Line.

It is believed, however, that steps are in progress, probably by re-arrangement of shares, which will give the Canadian Pacific practical control in the near future, thus securing an impregnable position for business in Scotland, France, North of Ireland and elsewhere.

It has been urged in France to adopt aluminum for the pieces of ten and five centimes, which now are made of bronze. The advantages urged are the durability of the metal, its malleability, its metallic sonority, and its lightness. Great stress is laid on this last point, which, it is asserted, would enable the small coins to be easily distinguished from silver in the pocket, and make it possible to carry them in quantity without being annoyed by the weight.

Meeting Of Liberal Electors

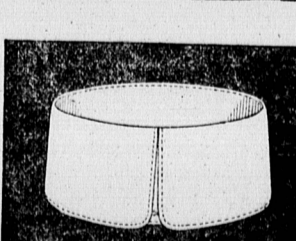
A Public Meeting of the Liberal Electors of Charlottetown and Royalty will be held in the Board of Trade Rooms (up stairs in the Market Building) on
