The fire had made such headway at eight o'clock a. m. when discovered, that by ten o'clock nothing was left of the building. Willing neighbors came to Mr. Huestis' assistance and succeeded in saving the furniture and the doors. 2,000 bushels of potatoes which were in the cellar were unfortunately destroyed. The house was valued at \$5,000, with only about \$1500 insurance. Mr. Huestis expects to rebuild almost at once and is at present living with his son, Mr. Earl Huestis, of Wilmot.—S
