## Contract Bridge

### PENALTY DOUBLES

Many expert players take liberties with penalty doubles, and therefore it is not a crime to follow their example and double a contract without the setting trick actually at hand. There are, however, certain requirements that every well-considered double must meet. Consider this case:

South dealer.  
Both sides vulnerable.

It is fairly obvious that North fell into a "dream situation," when West doubled the three-notrump contract. North was ready to deliver seven diamond tricks and the club king, hence it was the next thing to make over-tricks. It was conceivable, of course, that West had been lying in wait with a long and solid spade suit, but North was ready to risk that. South scarcely would bid as he had with nothing of great value in diamonds, no better than the ace-queen of clubs and some high hearts—in other words, with the spade suit wide open.

The redouble turned out to be an excellent venture on North's part. West opened a heart giving South three tricks in that suit, and an immediate club lead to the king brought even a greater reward when West, undoubtedly flustered, put up the club ace and then returned a club to knock out the king. This meant that West never did make his spade ace, and North-South consequently collected 1200 points for extra tricks above the line, to say nothing of the 400 below, the 50-point bonus for fulfilling the contract, and the rubber bonus. Getting back to the question of doubling, West lacked the prime ingredient—a stopper in the suit announced by North and which might be (so far as West could tell) both very long and very solid. With even one diamond stopper, West might have been forgiven for his optimism.
