**STOCK QUOTATIONS**  
Stock Markets At A Glance

**CHICAGO, Feb. 1 (AP)**—Grain markets were quiet today and prices were steady to firm with wheat and rye up as much as a cent a bushel during the final hour. Offerings were light and confined to the hard spots.  
**WINNIPEG, Feb. 1 (CP)**—Bye futures advanced nearly three cents today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange with the May and July going to new seasonal highs. Cash prices: Oats: 2 feed 50, 3 feed 48 other grades 51 1-2; barley: All grades 94 3-4, screenings 11.50 per ton; Rye: 1 C.W. 1.21-1.4; 2 C.W. 1.21 1-4, 3 C.W. 1.15 3/4; 4 C.W. 1.08, 4 C.W. 1.12 track 1.21.

**TORONTO, Feb. 1 (CP)**—The gold stocks were back on the rising trend today on the Toronto Market in posting an index gain of .73 while trading fairly actively. The Base Metals and Western Oils had minor index gains at the close.  
Pickle Crow in the medium-price list and Moneta among the juniors led the action with heavy turnover and wide gains. Pickle Crow traded 19,500 shares and closed at 2.20 for a net advance of 27 cents. The day's high was 3.25.

**NEW YORK, Feb. 1 (AP)**—Dollars enjoyed a burst of strength in today's Stock Market and were followed to a certain extent by selected rails and industrials.  
On the side of the rails was the 81 dividend of Delaware and Hudson, first since 1923 when \$1.50 was paid. This stock opened nearly half an hour late on an 8,000-share block, up 3 points at 42, a new peak. It ended up 4 1-4 at 46-1/4.  
The Associated Press 60-stock composite was up 2 of a point at 58.9 while the utility average advanced 5 to 40.2, best level in five years. Transfers totaled 1,558,510 shares compared with 1,117,900 Wednesday.

**MONTREAL, Feb. 1 (CP)**—Papers negotiated a rise on average in cautious trading today on the Stock Exchange. The Curb Market and other pivotal groups were pegged lower in the indices though the margin of losses over gains was narrow and a good quota of issues remained stationary.  
Better in papers were Howard Smith, Abitibi Common and 6 per cent preferred, M & O, Fraser, Bachurst, Canadian Power and Paper Preferred and Consolidated Paper. Quebec preferred switched from the win to the loss area and others in arrears were Price, International Paper, Donaco and Dryden.
