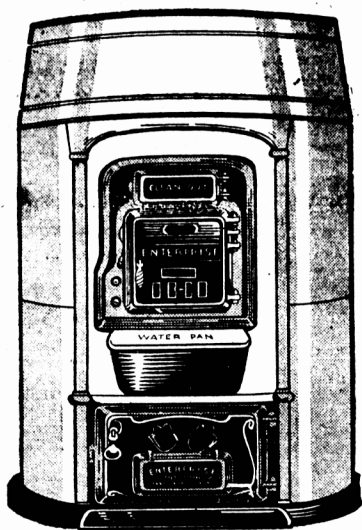

When East played the eight.

West, back on lead with the diamond queen, now faced a rather difficult decision. Could he drop the spade queen by jacking down in by shifting to another suit, so that East could return a spade through declarer's marked queen? West, after due thought, did not like either of these remote possibilities. It was extremely unlikely that the spade queen would fall, and it was equally dangerous to try to put East in the lead at this point. West made his decision and carefully selected the spade ten for his present return.

South, winning with the spade queen, now collected two more diamonds tricks, while West discarded a heart and a club, and East, resolutely holding on to his spade eight and his three hearts, parted with a low club.

Now South, striving desperately for a throw-in play, cashed the heart king and ace, drawing West's hearts in that suit, and finally exited with the spade six, hoping that West, after running the spades, would have to lead a club away from the king. West, however, had saved the spade four, and

it was East who won this present lead and returned a club. That was too much for the declarer!
