A Four And A Half Day Atlantic Service.

The Deutschland made the trip across the Atlantic last week in 5 days 11 hours. If Halifax, instead of New York, had been the vessel's terminal on this side the ocean, the trip would have been made in 4 days 10 hours. It is much to be regretted that Canada does not take advantage of her unique geographical position by instituting a fast Atlantic service from Halifax. We will have such a service before long, and it will prove a profitable venture. When it is established, and when our vessels are crossing the ocean in 4 1/2 days people will wonder why we didn't start the service 20 years ago. Whatever the time of crossing the Atlantic may be reduced to by the vessels running to New York, that time can be still further reduced by one-fifth by the Halifax route. If the New York boats get the time down to 5 days, we can reduce it to 4, and so on. The geographical advantage which Halifax enjoys over every United States port, one which no invention can deprive her of. The future of a fast line between the nearest points, on either side of the ocean.

PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND

And Its Attractions to Tourists.
Prince Edward Island's summer climate is delightful, and the scenery is beautiful and quietly picturesque. Surrounded by the Gulf of St. Lawrence, it enjoys all the coolness of the sea breeze, and the advantages that can only be derived from sea bathing, at about 65 degrees.

Charlottetown has over 12,000 inhabitants, and is the capital. It has many great retail stores, besides a large wholesale trade. It has a Gas Light and Power Company, two Electric Light plants, and a street railway is in embryo. It has a first class water works and sewerage system. It is famed for its wide and shaded streets its many pleasant drives, the principal of which is the new Park Boulevard, its attractive surroundings, pure water and clear, cool and bracing air. It is widely known as one of the healthiest cities in Canada. It has two hospitals, many churches and a large and elegant new Opera house. It also has several fine public buildings and a market which is one of the chief sources of the citizens' here. It has one of the largest and best equipped pork-packing establishments in the Dominion. On its west side Victoria Park—a favorite summer resort—while on the east are the magnificent new Exhibition Buildings and Driving Park. Chief among its public squares is Queen Square in the centre of the city, beautifully laid out with blooming plants of every description, fountains, and well arranged walks, and enlivened with a band of music during the summer evenings. The rural scenery in the vicinity of Charlottetown is charming, and horses for driving are abundant at very low prices. Boats can also be hired, and steamers run regularly on the bays and rivers, affording most pleasant excursions. The principal hotels are Davies, Queen, and Revere.

Summerside has about 3000 inhabitants. It is situated on beautiful Bedeque Bay. It has the largest and finest departmental store in the Maritime Provinces, besides having other large retail stores. It has an Electric Light Plant, and a water works system and sewerage are being agitate for. The hotels are—Clifton, Queen, Ross Strathcona and Campbell.

Georgetown and Souris have a population of about 1,000 each. In the former are the Aitken, and Tapper hotels and in Souris the Sea View.

At Cape Traverse, a very pleasant summer resort, is the Landsdowne hotel; in Alberton, the Albion Terrace and Wisner; in Tignish the Railway and Bellevue; in Kensington, Clark's and Commercial; in Montague, McDonald; and in Mount Stewart, Clark's and Manson's.

The following hotels open for the summer season: At Hampton, Pleasant View; at Stanhope, Mutch's and Cliff; at Brackley Point, Shaw's; at Rustico, Sa; at Malpeque, North Shore; at Tracadie Beach, Acadia; at Alberton, Seafort; and at Powna Florida.

In addition to those already mentioned there are other towns and villages in the Province with hotel accommodation, while many farm houses prepare for the reception of tourists. The rivers and streams teem with trout, the bays with mackerel, while game of every description is abundant.

Experience with Autos

The first annual report of the New England Electric Vehicle Transportation Company affords reliable statistics as to the progress that is being made in the use of noiseless carriages. This company operates in Boston, and it has one hundred and forty-one vehicles in service, and is adding sixty more to its equipment. The aggregate distance covered by the vehicles during the past year is one hundred and twelve thousand miles. The daily mileage at present is between two and three thousand. To do this business it is necessary to handle daily storage batteries weighing in the aggregate between four and five hundred tons. The magnitude of these figures shows that the automobile central station is already beginning to assume the importance and the size of the electric light or trolley stations.—Toronto World.
