Contract Bridge

A Well Calculated Risk
As every experienced duplicate player knows, certain risks may be taken at the match-point game that would be absurd at rubber bridge. Observe how an outstanding pair won "top on a board" in this deal:

South dealer.
Both sides vulnerable.
Match-point duplicate

♠ 9 7 6
♥ 9 8 5 4 2
♦ 8 2
♣ A K Q

♠ A 8 4
♥ Q 10 7
♦ J C 6
♣ J 10 8 4

♠ N
♥ E
♦ W

The bidding at most of the best was as follows:
South West North East

led back a club, this declarer cashed the ace and king of hearts, braving an adverse ruff, then led a low spade and finessed against the eight-spot. (He was confident enough that East would not have played the ten from 10-8). When dummy's seven held, South threw his heart three on the third club, then ruffed a heart with a high trump. Now he went back to dummy with the nine of spades and discarded both of his diamonds on the established trumps.
If a defender had been able to ruff the ace or king of hearts, or if East had been false-carding when he played the trump ten, this South would have been punished for his chance-taking, but actually he reaped the reward of his courage and imagination.

AT THE DENTIST
