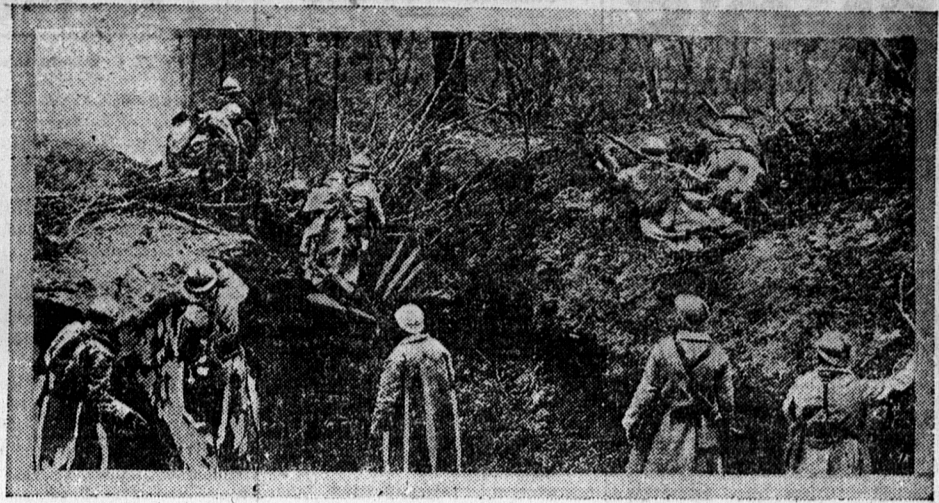
MRS. ANGUS NICHOLSON

DON'T SWAT FLIES PREVENT THEM BREEDING

The fly menace comes upon us every year with the certainty of death and the taxes. These filthy insects, born and reared in the foulest cor-

ruption are a prolific source of disease, notably of Typhoid, Tuberculosis, Dysentery, infantile Diarrhoea.

Dr. J. T. C. Nash in the Journal of the Royal Sanitary Institute states emphatically that: "The fly is responsible for the death of many children because of polluting the milk that they drink." Many other noted authorities confirm this view and instances may be multiplied where fatal diseases are directly traceable to the contamination of food by flies. These vile insects feed upon all

manner of corrupting matter and become literally infested with germs with which they infect foodstuffs infallibly when permitted to crawl upon it. It is, therefore, the bounden duty of every citizen to "do his bit" in the incessant war on flies.

Poison, prepared in a convenient form especially for the purpose is a method very generally used now-a-days. It has the advantage of being clean and very cheap, besides being continuously effective.
