**HALIFAX COMPANY MAKING SUCCESS OF MANUFACTURING**

The Britannia Manufacturing Co., Ltd., is an Object Lesson for the Board of Trade Committee.

That manufacturing can be carried on successfully in Halifax has been demonstrated by the Britannia Manufacturing Co. Ltd., manufacturers of ladies' wear. This industry is located at 30-38 Granville Street. A representative of the Chronicle called upon Mr. James Anderson, manager of the company the other afternoon. Mr. Anderson took the reporter to the scene of action. It is situated on the top floor of the Keith building, a most admirable location for such a business. It is cool, even when the mercury is hovering around 90, and the view from the windows, which are numerous on all sides of the building, cannot be excelled. The harbor from its every aspect could be taken in.

The room presented a busy scene. Fifty young women, Mr. Anderson informed the reporter, were working steadily away, some on machines and some at hand work, at ladies' garments of every description, and judging by the systematic manner in which they worked, a great deal of material must be transformed into wearing apparel in the course of a day. The machine rooms are in the north and south of the building, the best and most advantageous points, because of the good light that can be obtained.

This concern started operations three years ago in 32 Granville St. It was a modest start, but business increased so quickly and so substantially were the results that today, the staff numbers over 50, with very strong indications of a steadily increasing business. They have sent their representatives into the markets of Canada with great success. In Nova Scotia they have an encouraging trade, as also in New Brunswick, and even as far west as Winnipeg; the general excellence of their goods have made for them, ready markets, with ever increasing sales.

It is not as if the goods were taken on speculation, with the idea that they were not as good. They are not taken for sentimental reasons, because they are made in Canada, but it is their genuine worth, their reliability, which makes for them, markets in the great West, and gives promise of making markets for them all over Canada. Halifax made goods have long ere this gone abroad and to their credit. They have by their superior quality and workmanship, met stiff competition, and it is no idle assertion to make that the Britannia Co. have the same chance, and they are making the most of it, to accomplish the same results.

**"WEEKLY" CHANGED TO "TRI-WEEKLY"**

The "Weekly Edition" of "The Charlottetown Guardian" was changed on July 1st to a "Tri-Weekly Edition." This was done because it is considered that the "Weekly" is too slow for a province with so many daily and tri-weekly papers as that of Prince Edward Island. In the past, four or eight pages have been printed on Friday, eight on Saturday or Monday, and these twelve or sixteen pages have been held until the following Wednesday when eight more have been printed and then the entire twenty or twenty-four pages have been mailed as one paper to all subscribers. Thus the news of about two thirds of the issue is so old as to be of very little value when it reaches its destination the week following its actual publication. Now each section is mailed on Monday, Wednesday and Friday as soon as off the press. All the news is thus fresh, and each section of ads. and reading matter much more likely to be read thoroughly than if the entire twenty to twenty-four pages arrived but once a week, and all at one time. All advertisements will appear in but one section of each entire week's issue as in the past, unless it is desired that they appear more frequently, in which case arrangements can be made with the management. Regular advertisers in the past have been required to have "changes" in not later than Saturday, and by the time the paper reached subscribers the following week it was often desirable that other goods arriving in the meantime be advertised. Under the three-a-week issue "changes" received up to either Tuesday, Thursday, or Saturday at ten a. m. will be printed in either the Wednesday, Friday or Monday issue respectively, and thus reach readers when new and fresh. Transient advertisements can appear either once, twice or thrice a week as arranged for. It is believed that all readers will appreciate the change, as they will in future receive a paper, issued each Monday, Wednesday and Friday of every week instead of twenty to twenty-four pages issued but Wednesday of each week. Advertisers very much prefer that their ads appear but once a week in a tri-weekly rather than in a weekly of two or three times the size, as they are much more likely to be read carefully.
