UNIVERSAL WAR.

The gravity of the situation in China increases, and there is no longer a doubt that all the great military and naval powers of the world are at war with China. In some respects the condition of affairs is unprecedented. For instance, it is a struggle between the oldest Empire on earth and the more juvenile powers, whose history only covers from 125 to 1,000 years each. China was hoary with age in the days of Confucius, six centuries before the Christian era. It is a struggle between the powers of Europe and America with the one great Asiatic power—the West against the East. In a sense it is a struggle of civilization against barbarism, although China was semi-civilized while Europe was still savage, and had a knowledge of printing and of gunpowder when the people of the West had never seen a printed page and fought with bows and arrows. It is a struggle between Christendom and Heathendom in the last great stronghold of idolatry.

These are unique conditions, but equally without precedent is the number of the earth's people who are, at least nominally involved in warfare against each other. We know, in fact, that the war of the powers against China will be limited in its area, will be fought out on Chinese soil and with inevitable triumph to the arms of civilization. But when the war is once entered upon and while it continues all the peoples of the Empires, Kingdoms and Republics and of their dependencies that are parties to the conflict must be and remain at war with the people of China. The Chinese number approximately 400 millions. The Empires of Britain, Russia, Germany, Austria-Hungary and Japan, the Kingdom of Italy, the Republics of the United States and France with their dependencies number probably 800 millions. Such are the stupendous numbers of the people whom the war in some sort renders hostile. It is in fact practically an universal war to which we are brought in this last year of the nineteenth century. There are other wars also in progress, but they shrink into insignificance when contrasted with the larger struggle, though Britain has 200,000 men battling in South Africa, and is suppressing a rebellion in Ashantee, while the United States has still some 65,000 men engaged in warfare in the Philippines.

The military strength on a war footing of the powers now embroiled against China represents a total of over 20 millions of armed men, a million horses and 15,000 cannon. Their united naval strength includes 200 battleships and 450 cruisers, besides other armed sea-craft without number. Against such forces China's total war strength on land is under 500,000 men, while her navy would be powerless to face even the Eastern Squadron of the weakest of the naval powers. Humanly speaking there can be no doubt of an easy victory and conquest by the concerted powers. China cannot put a single one of them in peril. The danger, and it is an appalling one, is to the Europeans, missionaries and native Christians who may be still left alive within the Empire. They make a total of possibly a million souls in all. It is to be feared that many thousands have already suffered and that thousands more may suffer massacre, and that the greatest peril will surround those who remain alive, until a decisive blow can be struck and Pekin is captured.
