SURVIVORS OF THE STR. COLUMBIA TALK

Following is the story of Chief Officer Tier, who commanded and was one of the four survivors in the life-boat of the burned steamer Columbia that was picked up after a fortnight's tossing and drifting on the briny deep.

"We left the Columbian at 2 p. m. on Monday, May 4th, in a great hurry, following a heavy explosion. We had no compass in our boat as it has been taken out for cleaning. We had matches and a lantern but there was a strong wind and the spray prevented us from securing a light. We kept the Columbian in sight until daylight. The smoke and fire of the ship enabled us to see her until that time. Then the rain began to fall and we lost sight of the ship. We did not attempt to row or sail but put out our sea anchor and drifted. That day a four-funnelled steamer passed us about a mile and a half away but we were unable to make any signal before she passed us by. The next morning, Tuesday, May 5th, a steamer with a black, red-banded, funnel-passed us about four miles away but we could not attract her attention. On the forenoon of the 5th a Cunard liner came within two miles of us and seemed to stop as though picking up something. She soon disappeared, however, and after that we saw no ship until the Seneca picked us up.

THICK WEATHER.

"For the fourteen days that we were adrift the weather was thick with mist, fog and rain, but the day we were rescued was bright and clear and the sea smooth. "When we abandoned the Columbian, we had a cask of water, and the boat's bread tank was three-quarters full. I put the boats crew on rations, one biscuit and a half cup of water in the sail and in that way kept up our supply until we were rescued. The biscuits rapidly ran low and at the end of the first week the allowance was cut down by one-third.

"On Saturday, May 9, officer George Hull complained that he could not stand short rations of water and despite all the advice of the boat's company, began drinking sea water. That night he became delirious and

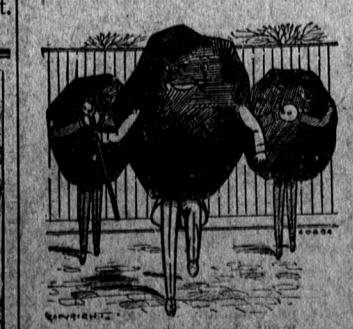

A STRANGE DREAM.

"The last one to die was Peter Trier, a Belgian boy, ordinary seaman. He died at five o'clock on Sunday morning about four hours before we sighted the Seneca. A peculiar incident about Trier was that before the ship sailed from Antwerp he told the men that he had had a dream of a sinking ship and being out at sea in an open boat for fourteen days before being picked up. After he had abandoned the ship he was constantly complaining that he would not be able to last out the fourteen days and that he would never see Antwerp again. On the morning of the fourteenth day Trier died. Fireman Fritz Jakob went insane and was more or less violent the day before he died. The death of the other men was unattended by any particular incident, all expiring as a result of hunger and exposure.
