In Boston, Mass., on January 31st, occurred the death of G. L. Scott formerly of Clyde River, P. E. Island, but lately of the above mentioned place. Mr. Scott removed from his native land while yet young, and has spent the greater part of his life in his adopted town.

THE Souris Board of Trade at their annual meeting Wednesday discussed telephonic communication to East Point, a double line to Souris and the placing of the Stanley on the Picou route. The officers elected were:—

PROF. E. E. Prince of the Department of Marine and Fisheries, Ottawa arrived by the ice boats Thursday. He conferred with Hon. Mr. Farquharson and Hon. Mr. McKinnon, about a site for the Fish Hatchery, and as a result a hatchery for salmon and trout will be built in Charlottetown, and one for lobsters at Alexandra, fronting on Hillisborough Bay. The work will commence shortly.

THE Canadian Grocer says—it is reported that D. J. Munn, the canning man of New Westminster, B. C., has secured an option of the stock and good-will of the English-owned canneries outside of the British Columbia Packers Association combine. Mr. Munn is paying cash for all the canneries and good-will, and this is said to be more satisfactory to the sellers than in the case of the Packers' Association, when, although the aggregate price for each cannery was greater, only one-third cash was paid, and the balance in common stock. The proposed scheme has met with the approbation of the members of the Packing Association. The new combine will have a capital of about \$5,000,000 and will include 30 canneries. (Mr. Munn above mentioned is a native of Little Sands and revisited his old home about a year ago).

At Belle River, on Dec. 27th last, Mrs. Donald McLeod in the 55th year of her age, after an illness of two months departed this life leaving a husband and seven of a family, four of whom are at home. One daughter is married in Massachusetts. Deceased was the only daughter of the late James Cook and Sarah Ann Cook, who still survives her. The deceased was a kind and obliging neighbor and a true Christian. There is the assurance that the promises of God are sure, inasmuch as in the world ye shall have tribulation, but in me ye shall have peace. Since her death comes the sad news of the mutiny on board the Barque Yronica, in which her son Angus, the mate was killed with the late Capt. Shaw. The doubly bereaved family have the sympathy of the whole community in their affliction.

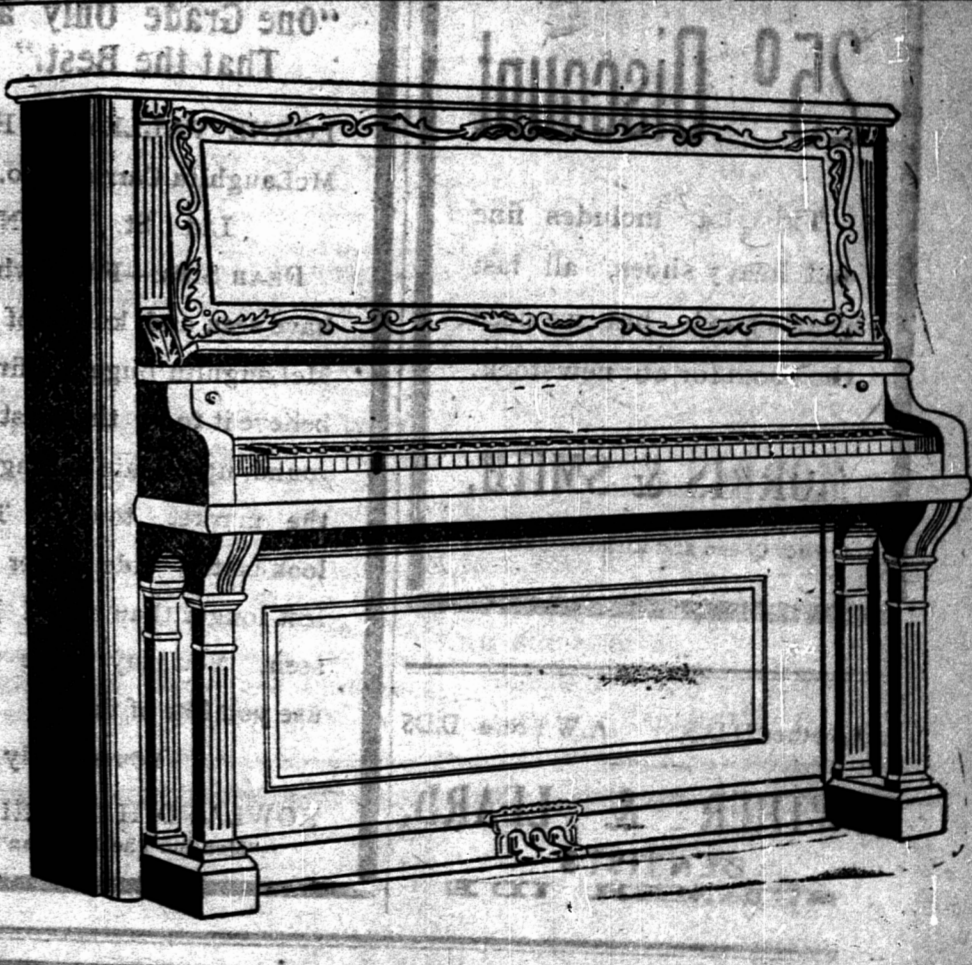
