 It is understood that Stanfields, Limited, will pay for the stock of the Hewson company, and that besides the current half year's dividend will be forthcoming.
 The acquisition of the Amherst mills will be a good thing for Stanfields, Limited, especially in the knitting department. It has been found difficult in Truro to obtain all the female help required in this work.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS
 ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.
 Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.
 In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$500 per acre.
 Duties.—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each six years from date of homestead entry including the time required to give homestead patent and cultivate fifty acres extra.
 A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption in certain districts. Price \$300 per acre.—Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.

LAND AND ROAD TAX 1911
 Notice is hereby given to owners, holders, and occupiers of lands in this Province that Land Tax for the year 1911, at the rate of 20c. on every \$100 valuation (buildings included) imposed by "The Land Assessment Act" will be due on the 1st day of November instant. Collectors of the districts wherein such properties are situated are now prepared to receive the same at their residences or offices respectively, up to the 15th day of December next. Immediately after that date Collectors will call upon ratepayers, whose taxes remain unpaid. If the taxes are not then received, a notice demanding payment within fourteen days will be left or mailed to each ratepayer in default, and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act executions for taxes remaining unpaid will be issued immediately after the expiration of the said fourteen days.
 Tax on land situated in the Royalty of Charlottetown (for which district a collector is appointed) is payable at the Provincial Treasury, Taxes on Township lands will be received from ratepayers at the Provincial Treasury up to the 30th of November instant, but not after that date.
 Five per cent discount will be allowed on Land Tax paid on or before the 30th November instant. No discount is allowed on Road Taxes.
ROAD TAXES 1911.
 Further notice is hereby given that under the provisions of "The Public Roads Act, 1907," there will be due and payable for the year 1911, on the 1st day of November instant, by each male person between the ages of twenty-one and sixty years (excepting Clergymen and Overseers) a tax of \$1 per head, and upon all horses over three years of age, owned by and in possession of any person residing within this Province (excepting horses owned by the Clergymen and Overseers) the sum of twenty-five cents each.
 Road Taxes are payable and collected at the same time as the Land Tax and by the same persons and process.
