Only Farmer Discuss

It should recognize that agriculture was vital to the future of Canada and that men must be encouraged to remain on the farm. But until agriculture could be made profitable there was no point in putting men on the land who were hopeless to think that a man was placed on a New Brunswick farm with any prospect of success. The government should assure that only those with farm background should be acceptable under the farm settlement plan.

C. E. Johnson (N.D. Bow River) said the bill left the way open to "get rid of a lot of headaches." After the first Great War the government had "pushed veterans off on farms" where they had to struggle with less noise. "Too many men were already engaged in agriculture and surplus were being produced."

Six Drowned Over Week-End

OTTAWA, July 20—(CP)—Dragging operations in the Gatineau River went on tonight in an effort to recover the body of Roger Lecompte, 14-year-old Hull boy, one of six persons drowned in Ottawa during the week-end.

The Canadian Press in an earlier story today, carried for afternoon papers, said erroneously that seven lives. This was caused by confusion between the names Lecompte and the name Lecompte and the name Lecompte.

The body was recovered Sunday in the Gatineau River near Bouchette. First reports of this drowning said the victim was a 15-year-old Wrightville, Que., boy named Lecompte.

Body of six-year-old James Sinclair of Ottawa was recovered from the Rideau Canal. The child had been missing from his home since he told his mother Saturday he was going fishing.

Others drowned were: Col. Lorne Ferguson, 26, of Warria, Ont.; Yvon Garon, 15, of Hull; Sgt. James Sorley, 34, of Toronto, attached to the Royal Canadian Air Force station at nearby Rockcliffe; and Melvin Seabrooke, 40, Richmond, Ont., farmer.
