This is the earliest that we have had reported this season. Mr. Peter Brodie who gave this information to the Guardian yesterday states that he has never seen better filled grain. He reports that the potato crop around York and Cove Head is looking splendid. There is a considerable quantity of seed potatoes at Marshfield, Suffolk and these are doing splendidly. The first inspector's tests were made about two weeks ago with gratifying results.

CITY PAY-DAY On account of the holiday Monday the city employees are receiving their monthly pay today. The pay sheet this fortnight amounts to nearly \$2,000 altogether. There are fifteen permanent sweepers employed in the streets and there are now about thirty men working on the concrete sidewalks. This work is nearly finished for the season. The sweepers receive \$2.50 a day and the concrete men from \$2.70 to \$3.50.

DESIGNATION SERVICE—The Presbytery of Prince Edward Island, at the request of the Deacons Board, arranged for the designation of Miss Adele McPherson to the Order of Deaconesses of the Presbyterian Church. The meeting was held on the evening of Aug. 21st in the Brookfield church, the church of her parents. Rev. Colin McNevin presided. The pastor of the Brookfield congregation, Rev. R. H. Stavert, deaconess, Rev. Geo. Millar gave the address to Miss McPherson the deaconess designated. Mrs. (Rev) Ernest Forbes of Scotsburn, N. S., the president of the Maritime W. M. S. Presbyterial with earnest and inspiring words, invested Miss McPherson with the Deaconess Badge. Mrs. Forbes later brought to Miss McPherson the greetings of the Maritime W. M. S. Presbyterial and briefly addressed the congregation present, and also presented the newly designated deaconess with a beautifully bound Oxford Bible in behalf of the W. M. S. Society of P. E. Island. The service throughout was a very impressive one. Miss McPherson graduated in April last from the Deaconess Training Home, Toronto, and is under appointment to Chalmers Presbyterian Church, Ottawa. HOW TO GET THE BEST OUT

By buying two pairs exactly alike at a time one will really have the benefit of three pairs of stockings, as one stocking of a pair always gives out before the other one does and with two odd ones you have another pair. If you do not believe this, look in your stocking bag and see how many odd stockings you have there. Suppose some of these odd ones matched. When the first little hole appears in the stocking, moisten it until you get an opportunity to mend it, as the moisture will prevent further running of the thread.

Instead of buying a satin hat for the season between summer and fall, purchase one of the adorable little felts which can be used again next spring and will act as a sports hat all year round. Felt shapes are always good as they clean easily, pack easily and can be used for almost any occasion. This year we see them at the smart resorts with the afternoon and dinner gown, as well as with the sport outfit.

Nearly every woman wears silk underwear these days. Tintex or coloring of some sort is essential towards keeping these silks in tone, as they fade after several washings. Try saving the Tintex wrenching water from week to week by placing it in a large bottle. One can make a box of Tintex go twice as far this way. Often a drop or two of red ink added to wrenching water will add enough color to brighten the faded pink garment.

So many people wear down the heels of shoes before the rest of the shoe gives out. Watch for the first sign of wearing and have new leather heel tabs put on by a cobbler before the heel permanently turns. Nothing is uglier or more uncomfortable than a shoe with a crooked heel. By keeping the heel straight the shoe wears a great deal longer.

Buying two pairs of corsets at one time and wearing them on alternate days prolongs the life of each corset, by holding its shape. Always smooth the corset out after wearing, and roll it up, as this also helps keep it in shape. Never wear a corset until it becomes discolored by perspiration as perspiration rots the material. Either send it to the cleaner or wash it with ivory soap and warm water using a scrubbing brush.
