SPANIARDS IN MOROCCO.

TANGIER, Feb. 24.—It is reported that Spanish troops have occupied Arzila on the Atlantic coast, some ten miles South Tangier. The action of the Spaniards is believed to be due to the opposition to the operations of the Moorish Telegraph Company which is now stringing wires from Arzila for connection with the line between Tangier and Rabat.

STEAMER CACOUNA DAMAGED BY ICE.

LOUISBURG, Feb. 22.—The Steamer Adventure, sailed for St. John's this morning, and the steamer Isleworth, Capt. Redding, for Boston. The Cacouna, Capt. Marsters, sailed for Halifax last evening with a cargo of coal, but while off St. Esprit, meeting some ice which appeared to be only a light nature, the engine were stopped however, and although the ship was only moving through it at a very low speed she struck a heavy ice pan or other obstruction, with the result that a hole was made in her port bow, the fore peak filling with water. The Captain decided to put back to Louisburg, and arriving in port this morning at three o'clock. Temporary repairs will be effected there, and then the steamer will proceed to her destination.

DUKE GIVES TROPHY FOR FANCY SKATING.

OTTAWA, Feb. 21.—H. R. H., the Duke of Connaught has presented to the Minto Skating Club of Ottawa, as first custodians a beautiful trophy to represent the figure skating championship of the world. It is to be won in open competition by teams of four skating in international style, the first competition to be held in Ottawa in 1912 and annually thereafter in this city.

C. P. R. PURSER UNDER ARREST.

LIVERPOOL, Feb. 21.—Frederick Atherton, a purser on the Empress of Britain, was committed to Bow St. yesterday charged with defrauding the C. P. R. and the Dominion Express of over \$3,000 pounds sterling.

CASH REGISTER MEN INDICTED.

CINCINNATI, Feb. 22.—The Federal Grand Jury in session here today returned thirty indictments against officials and employees of the National Cash Register Company of Dayton. The indictments allege violations of the Sherman anti-trust law. The Grand Jury probe followed an investigation by the Department of Justice of charges that the National Cash Register Company is maintaining a monopoly. O. E. Harrison, Assistant Attorney-General, represented the government before the Grand Jury. The same Grand Jury returned an indictment of eleven counts against the Adams Express Company, charging the collection of rates higher than the schedule. Seven Cincinnati firms were also indicted charged with attempting to secure transportation at lower rates than those established by the Interstate Commerce Commission.

PARIS, Feb. 22.—Vedrine and Beaumont, who went neck-in-neck in the around-England aeroplane race last summer, in which the latter just beat the former, have both gone on the lecture platform. Vedrine has been touring the south of France on his monoplane just as another man would in an automobile. He lectured at Toulouse in his aviator's suit of dark blue with white sweater and for two hours kept his audience enthralled with his story of air excursions.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS. Any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of the homesteader. Duties.—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 50 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$20 per acre. Duties.—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain pre-emption may enter a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$20 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and enter a house worth \$2,000. Deputy of the Minister of the Interior. 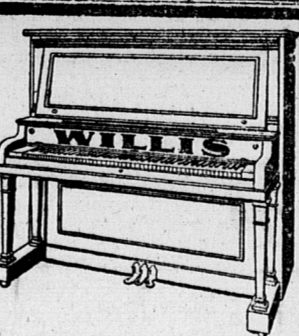
