GENERAL ORLOFF A SECOND NERO

LONDON, March 28.—The correspondent of the Tribune in the Baltic provinces thus describes the execution of 85 Lettish rebels at Pillin.

It was a dark and frosty night. Outside the town in the course of the day a great pit had been dug. To this pit men were brought bound from the prison, most elementary teachers and peasants of the more intelligent class, compelled to kneel and then shot. They fell into the pit, many of them still alive. As the soldier filled up the pit many of the wounded groaned and cried as the earth fell on them.

At that moment Gen. Orloff sat in a club with officers and nobles emptying champagne bottles. As the officer in charge of the executions brought in his report, 'Your Excellency, they have all been shot,' the arch-murderer, who had himself been sent back from Manchuria in disgrace, replied, 'Good man! You deserve the St. George's Cross.'

A WIRELESS RECORD

PLYMOUTH, England, March 28.—On the voyage from New York the Hamburg-American liner 'Deutschland' which arrived here to-day on the way to Cherbourg and Hamburg, maintained a continuous communication by wireless telegraph with the station at Lizard Head, Cornwall, from a distance of 2,000 miles out from Lizard Head until she reached Plymouth.

EDITOR'S MAIL. FISH AND GAME PROTECTION.

SIR:—If the members of the local F & G clubs have any real grievance against the Provincial Association, they ought to state it in a clear open manner, so that the general public could decide for themselves as to the merits of the present controversy.

The agitation for the better preservation of fish and game was started by the Provincial Association last summer. At considerable expense to itself the Provincial Association sent one of its officers all through the Province holding public meetings in the interests of fish and game protection, at each of which the people were invited to give their ideas as to what methods should be adopted to bring about the ends in view. The holding of these meetings resulted in the awakening of a keen interest in, and a general recognition of, the immense importance of the preservation of the fish and game of the Province.

After the movement became a popular one, four local clubs, in the vicinity of the city, were started three months ago, for the secret purpose of checking the work of the Provincial Association, under the plea of protecting the fish and game in their own districts.

In order to further their secret ends, they circulated everywhere incorrect and absurd accounts of what the Provincial Association was trying to do; carefully concealing the fact that as soon as they started their clubs, the Provincial Association invited them to affiliate or at any rate for their head officers to become members of the Association so that they could be placed on the Provincial Executive Committee and thus ensure perfect harmony and united efforts in all that should be done towards the accomplishment of the ends that all were supposed to have in view.

One club did propose to unite with the Provincial Association but objected to paying the membership fee of one dollar per year. This objection was met by the Provincial Association, by stating that here must be a fund raised to carry on the work but, taking into consideration the members of the local club wished to keep up a club of their own, and would attend to most of the work in their own districts, they would permit their members to unite and enjoy all the privileges of full membership if they contributed 25 cents instead of \$1. per year. This offer was rejected by the clubs as too much to contribute for their share of the expense of carrying on the work of protecting the fish and game of the province and the rights and privileges they would receive as members of the Provincial Association.

The delegates from that club were present at the quarterly meeting of the P. E. I. Fish and Game Protection Association, and had more to say than any one else as to what provisions should be incorporated in the proposed new game law. Incidentally it might be remarked that every concession granted to the said delegates was vigorously opposed by the same club's representative at the conference held by the Provincial Government last Tuesday.

There is no exclusiveness about the Provincial Association. Unlike the local clubs, a new member has not to be proposed and balloted for. Any one who wishes to, can become a member and enjoy all the privileges conferred or about to be conferred on members of the Association, by simply contributing one dollar towards the expenses of carrying on the work of protecting the fish and game of the Province.

FAIR PLAY.

THE INSURANCE BILL.

SIR—In regard to the Life Insurance Bill now before the House and to which reference is made by Mr. Justice Hodgson in his letter in this morning's Guardian I am pleased to see that so eminent an authority as Justice Hodgson has pronounced the Bill a good one and that its provisions are all in favor of the "insured." I must however take exception to his statement that the agents of the companies are united in their opposition to it.

For several years I have been endeavoring to get an insurance law enacted in this Province similar to that in force in other parts of Canada and on April 29th 1904 I addressed a letter to every legal firm in the city urging them to take some steps towards having such a law placed on our statute books.

Again in 1905 I obtained a copy of the New Brunswick Act which I handed to Hon. F. L. Hazzard and asked him to introduce it here and have also spoken several times to Premier Peters in regard to it. This is the Act that is being introduced in our Legislature today and as I am in a way responsible for the introduction I take this opportunity of explaining to Justice Hodgson and to the public my position in the matter.

The Act is framed entirely in the interests of the policy holders and there is not a clause in it favoring the companies. I trust it will become law at an early date.
