Montreal Stock Prices Irregular

MONTREAL, April 30—(CP)—Stocks generally followed an irregular course with selected issues accounting for bulk of the limited trading on the stock exchange and curb market today. There was no noticeable effect on dealings following yesterday's release of the 1947 Federal budget.

Among more active issues, Canadian Breweries jumped 1 5-8 at 26 3-8 after a favorable dividend declaration. Lewis added 1-8 at 16 1-4. Unchanged, the close after minor fluctuations were Imperial Oil, Consolidated Paper and Southmount. Petroleum was off 1-4 at 14 and B. C. Forest 1-8 at 3 3-8.

Smelters advanced 5-8, Seagrams, International Paper and Nickel 1-2. Fairchild 3-8 and Brown and Bank of Montreal 1-8. Steady were Alco "A", Dryden, Tobacco, McColl, National Breweries, after an early increase. United Steel, C. W. Lumber and Ford. Mines were dull and lightly traded.

Trading box score: Total sales, 128,700 shares; industrials, 51,700; mines, 77,000; stocks higher, 50; lower, 44; unchanged, 73; new highs, 3; new lows, 15.

Stocks Rally On New York Exchange

NEW YORK, April 30—(AP)—The stock market closed out a losing month today with a slow moving rally that pushed selected leaders 1 to around 3 points higher. Steels, backed by good first quarter earnings reports and new wage settlements, along with motors and some industrial "blue chips" were principal beneficiaries in the first rising session of the week. The ticker tape idled frequently except for surges of demand at the opening and again in early afternoon. Total transfers dwindled to 780,000 shares.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite climbed 5 of a point to 61.9 where it was 3 1/2 points below its level at the start of April. Bottom for the month and the market's lowest since Oct. 29, 1946, was touched April 18 with the average at 60.7.

McIntyre, although recovering most of its early losses, closed off 1-8 among Canadian issues which generally registered fractional increases. Canadian Pacific, Dome Mines and Distillers Seagram each added 1-4. On the curb, Lake Shore and Giant Yellowknife each added 1-8.

Those with prominent gains included General Motors at 57 7-8, up 1 3-8; Du Pont at 180, ahead 3 1-2; Montgomery Ward at 53 1-2, up 2 1-4 and Monsanto Chemical at 54 3-4; up 2.

Petrol and Eastern lost 3 3-4 to close at a new low of 8 after news of a special master's unfavorable report on litigation of its inter-company accounts with New York Central. Among other losers were Pacific Western Oil, duplicating Tuesday's 2 1-2 point decline; and Northwest Airlines.

Trading Slow On Toronto Exchange

TORONTO, April 30—(CP)—Canada's 1947 budget exerted no noticeable influence on stocks on the Toronto Stock Exchange today as volume was lower than the last few days and prices moved without apparent reflection on the budget provisions. An exception to this was, perhaps, the western oils list which moved up actively possibly due to the extension through 1948 of tax benefits on exploration work. Mining issues fell back with a fairly sharp drop for golds.

The exchange's closing index listed golds down 1.13 to 102.78 and a new low for the year, base metals down .33 to 85.53 and western oils up .88 to 24.69. Volume for the day was 777,000 shares for a drop of 69,000 shares from yesterday's total.

Western oils were active on gains for Anglo-Canadian, British Dominion, Calgary and Edmonton, Calmont, Home Oil, Mid-Continent, Okalla, Pacific Petroleum and Roxana.

Senior golds were weak with only one gain for La Luz and six losses including Bralor, 1-4 at 10 1-2, Hollinger 1-4 at 10, Kerr Addison 1-8 at 13 7-8, Lake Shore 1-4 at 14, McIntyre 1-2 at 56 1-2. Secondary issues posted almost three losses to each gain and the range was wider. Among gainers were Campbell, Negus, Powell, Rouyn, Toburn, Wekusko, while losers took in Chesterville, Donald, Elder, Giant, God's Lake, Goldhawk, Lingman, Louvicourt, Madsen, Marcus, Norpik, O'Brien, San Antonio, Sullivan. Base metals were down for East Sullivan, Bureka, Golden Manitou, MacDonald, Osisko, Quemont, Sherit and up for Chromium, Nickel Labrador, Noranda.
