

SIR GEORGE WILLIAMS ANNUIVERSARY

Founder of Y. M. C. A. 100

The Y. M. C. A.'s all over the world were celebrating last week the anniversary of the birth of George Williams, founder of the Association.

Sir George Williams was born near Duleston, England, Oct. 11th, 1821, in the heart of the country "immortalized" by Blackmore's "Lorne Doone." He entered the firm of Hitchcock and Rogers, St. Paul's Churchyard, London, married the daughter of the proprietor and eventually became the head of the firm. He died in his eighty-fourth year, and his body entombed in St. Paul's Cathedral November 14, 1905.

In 1844 he gathered a dozen men about him and in a small room over a dry goods warehouse, founded the Young Men's Christian Association. In 1851 the movement took root in North America, two associations being opened simultaneously in Boston and Montreal. Within the span of his life George Williams saw the Young Men's Christian Association, both as an organized and as a spiritual force, encircle the earth. When its founder died in 1905, sixty-one years after its beginning, the Y. M. C. A. had 7,773 Associations, with 722,000 members, totals which have since grown to more than 8,000 Associations and more than 1,500,000 members.

The Charlottetown Y. M. C. A. was organized New Year's Day, 1856. Several clergymen and laymen met in St. Paul's church school room and thus formed the second oldest Association in Canada. Rev. Wm. Snodgrass, minister of the Kirk, now known as St. James' Church, delivered the inauguration address on the evening of Feb. 6th 1856, Lt. Hancock, R. N., one of the vice presidents, being in the chair.

In the year 1872 the Association decided to erect a building, which they did and which was opened in the summer of 1873 and which is in use today and which has the distinction of being the first building erected for Association purposes alone on the North American continent.

The following were the first officers elected January 14th, 1856: President, Capt. Orlebar, R. N.; Vice President L. Hancock, R. N.; H. D. Morpeth and Jas. DeBrisay, Secy; Robert A. Strong, Treasurer

George Beer, Librarian. Samuel make an appeal to the people of Westastot. Prince Edward Island for voluntary subscriptions to wipe out the debt.
