KING PROROGUED THE PARLIAMENT

This Session Has been a Very Long and Arduous One

LONDON, August 29.—With all the picturesque old time ceremonial, the British Parliament was prorogued today, thus ending one of the longest and most arduous sessions during which the royal assent was given to over six hundred bills, which the two Houses passed. The members of the House of Commons assembled at noon, and shortly afterwards they were summoned to the House of Lords, where the King's speech was read. The statements made were of usual character, referring to the recent royal visit and the friendly relations existing between Great Britain and other Powers.

KING'S SON WHO TIRED SUICIDE

George Christich Attempted to Poison Himself, but was Stopped in Time

LONDON, Aug. 29.—A message from Constantinople, says that George Christich, the legitimized son of the King of Milan, attempted recently to commit suicide while visiting Priskipo Island, in the Sea of Marmora. He applied for admission into the Therapeutic in Vienna and for the purpose asked for a medical certificate for the Austro-Hungarian embassy at Constantinople. His family wished that the certificate be made out in the name of George Obrenovitch, the latter being the family name of the King of Milan, but the embassy physician declined on the ground that he had no knowledge of any such individual. The refusal exasperated the young man, who is of a highly nervous temperament and he determined to end his life by taking a dose of arsenic. His purpose was discovered in time to apply remedial and he is said to be out of danger.

NO MORE MONKEY BALLOON TRIPS

Humane Society at Kenosha Will Protect the Simians

KENOSHA, Wis., Aug. 29.—There will be no more monkey balloon ascensions in Kenosha if the orders of J. H. Karnes, the agent for the local humane society, are carried out. For the past three or four weeks one of the members of the simian tribe has been making ascensions at a local pleasure park, and has claimed that the monkey is forced to do all sorts of risk. Karnes notified the members of the park board Saturday that the exhibition must be stopped. "If any of you fellows want to make monkeys of yourselves and go up in a balloon, all right, but I am out to protect that God-made monkey, against cruelty." This was the ultimatum of the agent, and if it is disregarded warrants will be issued.
