At the Liberal Conservative convention for the third district of Queen's yesterday afternoon Peter McCourt was nominated for Councilman and T. A. McLean for Assemblyman. Leonard Wood, Mount Herbert was also a nominee and Dr. Dewar, Southport declined to accept the nomination. The present Liberal representatives of the district are Hon. J. H. Comiskey and H. James Palmer.

The vacancy in the pulpit of the St. Stephen Methodist church caused by the death of Rev. Dr. Read is being temporarily filled by John J. Pinkerton, a student of Mount Allison University, who will supply until October 1st. What will be done is as yet largely conjecture. Some who knew say that Rev. T. J. Deinstadt will then take the circuit, while others say that Rev. Charles Comben, at present supplying on the Welsford circuit for a year and that a call will then be extended to Rev. G. M. Young, at present stationed at Charlottetown.—St. John Sun.

ACCORDING to the reports of Chairman Aubrey White of the committee on constitution on Masonry presented last week at the Toronto board of general purposes held preliminary to the meeting of the grand lodge the order in Canada has made great strides in membership in the year just closed, having increased from 28,421 to 31,000. The report on audit and finance showed receipts of \$28,724 as compared with \$25,341 last year. This year's income is the largest in the history of the grand lodge. The expenditure for the year was \$22,807. Outside of the elections and the reports, the principal business of grand lodge will be in connection with certain proposed changes in the by-laws.

THAT even cows may possess more intelligence than many of a higher order was shown a day or two ago in an experience by which the owner of a valuable quadruped of the equine species came near meeting with the loss of the animal which he had recently purchased.
