A boy, aged 14, son of Tweed Barrow, while working around a thrashing mill, was caught by the fly wheel spindle and drawn in feet first, between the spindle and the revolving platform. Before the mill was stopped the whole body of the unfortunate boy was drawn in, the terrible crushing machine process being stopped only when the head had passed through. A later message conveyed the regrettable tidings of his death, which took place five hours after the accident happened.
