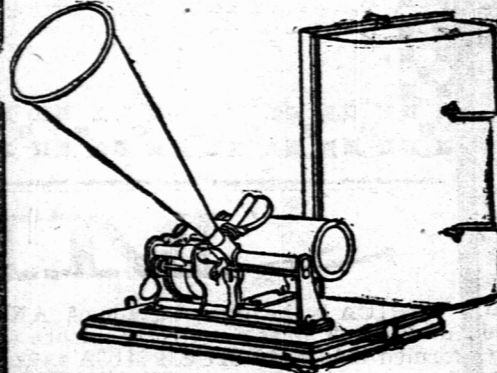

The vividness of his word-pictures is increased by several excellent maps, which he displays as well as some souvenirs of the war, such as rifles, shells, bulletins, and other things, which he secured in South Africa and which he exhibits to the audience. 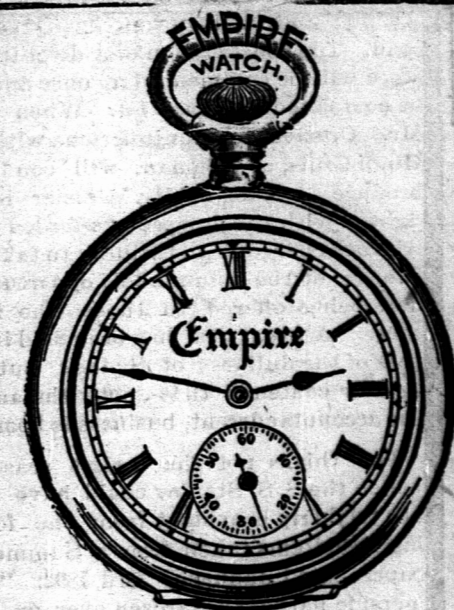
