The latest news, first of all.

All prizes won at the sports on the C. A. A. grounds at the Labor Day sports there will be awarded to the winners, at the Opera House on that evening, Sept. 5th.

Dr. C. B. Green, Egra McLean and J. W. Carruthers, Montague, came to the city Saturday from Coleman, where they had been camping out, and left on the afternoon train for their homes. I. A. G. Ellis, who was also a member of the party drove to his home.

Freddie Cameron Nova Scotia's champion runner, is at present "down on the farm" at Advocate, mowing hay and digging potatoes, and incidentally doing a few jaunts over the Advocate hills to keep his wind-sound and his limbs in proper shape. He expects to arrive back in Amherst next week.

Mr. Crisp, the son of the pastor elect of the Dorchester Methodist church, who is a ministerial student at Mt. Allison University, preached his final sermon Sabbath week. Rev. Mr Crisp and family have moved into the parsonage. The new pastor preached his first sermon on Sunday.

More cracks were showing their pace in a short limit handicap at Creve on Saturday says an English paper of Aug. 5th. The distance of the race was 110 yards, the winner turning up in E. Eastman, the negro flier from New Brunswick who received one yard start from Holway, and won by that distance in 11 seconds. Besides this F. C. Davies of Wales, the beat B. R. Day of Ireland by a few inches in a 700-yard match at Cardiff, the time being 1 minute 37 seconds, while C. H. Gardiner won a one-hour race at London on Monday, covering 11 miles and 60 yards, and an eleven-mile race on Tuesday, his time being just outside 63 minutes.

A. E. Wood, the ex-amateur champion, was also competing at Rainham, where he easily won a four-mile level race in 19 minutes 57 seconds.

A very profitable service was held last Sabbath morning in the Billard Hall of the deservedly popular hotel Markland, Yarmouth, N. S., in the presence of an intelligent and appreciative audience. Tait has just finished a particularly hard season during which he met such good Americans as Mel Sheppard, George V. Bonhag, Wilton C. Faull, Abel Kiviat, Harry Ginsins, to say nothing of such good Canucks as Arnold Knox, Chuck Skene and George Lister. Tait's defeat of George V. Bonhag in New York last spring, when Bonhag was at his best, was his best performance. He set a new world's indoor mile and a half mile record in this race. He also defeated Paull twice and chased Bonhag to town in the two-mile race at Buffalo, where Bonhag set a new world's mark. Tait was one of the most popular athletes Canada ever had, a boy whose honesty and integrity was always beyond reproach.
