

Recommendation on Turnip Seed

I strongly advise that only two varieties of Turnip Seed be planted with the hope of selling them as Table Stock Turnips for shipment from this Province this coming Fall.

The R. V. Ditmar Registered Turnip Seed grown in Nova Scotia is by far the most popular and 4-5 of your acreage should be planted Ditmar. The Laurentian Registered Turnip Seed, grown in Nova Scotia, this is a purple topped Turnip that we are trying to introduce but unfortunately it does not wax as well as the Ditmar variety and not more than 1-5 of your acreage should be Laurentian.

I strongly suggest that our Turnip growers plant not more than 1-4 of their acreage for the early market and for the remainder do not be in any hurry planting but use 2-12-6 with Borax and if possible have your land analyzed.

CHICAGO, March 18.—(AP)—Selling based on peace talk and trade uncertainty following the meeting of Hitler and Mussolini lowered wheat prices as much as 1 1/2 cents at times today but the market recovered most of this loss later.

When closed 1-4-5-8 lower than Saturday, May 1.01 1-2-6-8, Jy 99 1-4-3-8; Corn unchanged to 1-4 down, May 55 3-4-7-8, Jy 56 3-4; Oats 1-4-3-8 lower.

WINNIPEG, March 18.—(CP)—Liquidation, which followed rumors of peace moves in Europe, established an easier trend on Winnipeg grain, exchange today and wheat futures prices closed 3-4-5-8 lower.

May finished at 87 5-8 with Jy 88 7-8 and Oct 90 1-4 cents.

Hesitancy in American wheat and security markets gave a weak undertone to trading in the Winnipeg pit.

Livestock

MONTREAL, March 18.—(CP)—Steers were easier but other livestock classes were steady on the two Montreal livestock markets today, the Dominion Department of Agriculture reported.

Receipts were cattle, 855; calves, 904; sheep, 121; hogs, 1,698.

Good steers sold from \$7 to \$7.50 medium \$6.25 to \$7 and common from \$4.50 to \$7 over to \$8. A few baby heaves of fed calves of fair to medium quality made \$7 to \$8.50. Heifers ranged from \$4 to \$7. Good cows were \$5.25 to \$5.75 medium \$4.50 to \$5.25 and common \$3.75 to \$4.50. Cannons and cutters were \$3 to \$3.50. Good bulls were \$5.50 to \$6 common \$4 to \$5.25.

Calves were about steady with last Monday's quotations. Good veals made \$11 with medium good veals around \$10.50 and common light veals down to \$8. The bulk of the offerings were made up of common to just fair quality and brought mostly \$9 to \$9.50. Drinkers were \$5 to \$7.50 and graders \$4 to \$4.50.

Three early lambs of fair quality were sold at \$8 each. Last year's lambs were mostly bucks and brought around \$9. Sheep were \$4 to \$5 mostly \$5.50 to \$6.

Hogs were mostly \$9.35 to \$9.40 for bacon fed and water. Selected drew \$1 per hog premium with the regular cuts on off grades. Sows were \$6 to \$6.50. Hogs sold on rail grade brought mostly \$12.40 no weight.
