BRITAIN MOVES TO RESTRICT JAP TRADE

GOV'T. SEEKS CO-OPERATION OF DOMINIONS

Plan "Intensification" of Commerce Within Empire to Curb Japan's Export Drive.

LONDON, May 7.—The British Government moved today to restrict Japanese trade in those parts of the Empire over which it had direct control and to promote "intensification" of commerce within the British Commonwealth.

BEGIN TUBER PLANTING IN NEWBRUNSWICK

Forecast Shows Acreage Up To Normal Mark—Grain Plantings to Increase.

SERIES OF FATALITIES IN NOVA SCOTIA

Death List Grows As Tragedy Stalks Through Many Communities.
