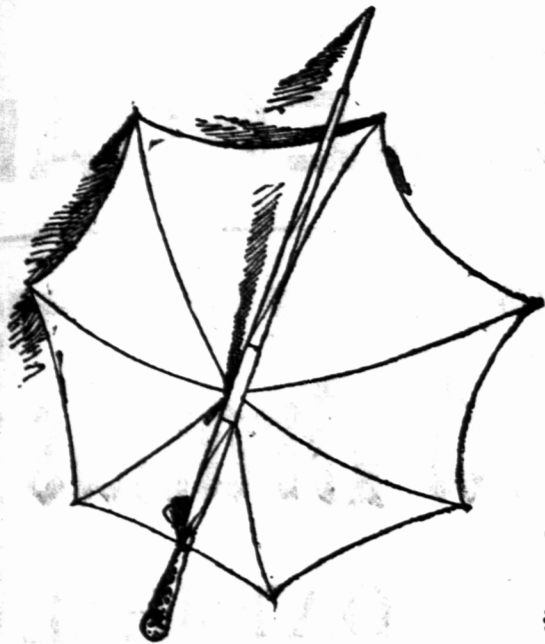

The New Souris East School.

Is a wooden building three stories high, eighty feet long, and thirty-six feet wide, built by McEachern and Dinwell, and heated by hot air. The first two flats are used as class-rooms, each having three rooms, and a corridor twelve feet wide extending the full length of the building.

On the inside of the building, two stairways, one in each end lead to the third flat, which might serve as an excellent hall. All the corridors and rooms have a wainscoting four feet high around the bottom of the wall. In the corridors separate cup-boards are placed for the clothing of each child. The outside of the building is painted white, except the trimmings which are brown. The trimmings on the inside are painted white, and the stairs and wainscoting finished with hard oil.

Altogether the building is as Governor McIntyre remarked in his speech the best on P. E. Island, Charlottetown schools excepted; combining advantage of location, with class-rooms convenient and attractive. The erection of this building reflects great credit on the trustees and citizens, who have a practical knowledge of the benefits derived from having the physical surroundings of children in harmony with the thoughts they would have them receive.

THE OPENING. The formal opening took place Tuesday October 31st. Lieut. Governor McIntyre and Mrs. McIntyre and eight of the principal citizens of the place, including ladies and gentlemen were present.

At the entrance of His Honor the pupils sang "God save the Queen." Miss Maud Morrow read an address at once cleverly written, appropriate to the occasion, as well as pleasingly and effectively delivered, in which was traced the educational development of Souris from the dinginess, smallness, and general air of discomfort of the old school house at Morris Pond in 1849 to the cheerfulness, beauty, and advantages of the present splendid structure.

His Honor gave a well fitting and very pleasing reply to the address, in which he related some amusing reminiscences of his own school days. Speeches some amusing, others highly instructive, but all marked by excellent good taste and judgment were delivered by the following gentlemen; John McLean; Rev. D. F. McDonald; Rev. J. A. McKay; Rev. S. Rice; Rev. J. N. Godfrey; Capt. Jackson; J. J. Hughes; Fredrick Morrow; Arch. Currie; and J. G. Sterns. The speeches were followed by "Rule Britannia," sung by the pupils with true patriotic fervor. The visitors departed after singing "God Save the Queen." The thanks of the school are due to the Young Ladies who so tastefully decorated the rooms with Union Jacks; and to Dr. A. A. McLellan to whom the success of the musical feature of the opening is due.
