

1,000,000 As Graft Payment

TOLEDO, O., Dec. 16.—Payment by law violators of \$1,000,000 in annual tribute to state city and county enforcement officials in Toledo and Lucas county was charged to-day, as a large force of federal prohibition agents swarmed upon more than a score of liquor stores on the east side and arrested 25 suspects.

Shortly after officials had been charged with exacting \$880,000 in bribes from bootleggers, gamblers and vice resort operators in the city and county, 55 operators, recruited from the four states, swung into a series of raids, arrested the alleged proprietors and held them incarcerated in county jail for questioning.
