Important Trade In P.E.I. Dairy Products With Goose Bay, Labrador

DENTAL COMMITTEE REPORT - In the report of the Summerside Dental Clinic issued by Miss Eleanor Wheeler, Public Health Nurse, it is shown that 133 children visited the clinic during the year while the total number of visits was 227 being ten months in each case than in the previous year. In her summary of the report, Miss Wheeler comments as follows: "The amount of work done on each child varied from one filling to ten fillings and from the extraction of one baby tooth to the extraction of four permanent teeth. Ten more patients were treated and sixteen more patients had work completed than last year, but considerable less work was done on the whole. Only 29 of the children were eight years old or younger, so there is very little difference in the age group treated from one year to the other. Very few complaints were received from the dentists about appointments not being kept. I am sure that the parents are unable to provide the care. I notice a great difference between the condition of the teeth of the children of Summerside and those of the children in the rural districts who have not as yet availed themselves of the Provincial grant for dental care." - S.

Possibilities for an important trade in dairy products is seen in the visit to Summerside this week of a U.S. plane from Goose Bay, Labrador, to purchase milk, eggs and other supplies. This is the third time a plane has come in for supplies from Goose Bay in the last three or four months and it would be an important benefit to the town if a regular schedule of trips could be arranged such as is carried on between here and Harmon Field, Newfoundland. Early in 1946 the contract was arranged with Harmon, chiefly through the initiative of Mr. Elmer Offer, proprietor of the Ideal Dairy, and since that time they have been making three trips weekly to this town. Each trip they average 226 gallons of pasteurized milk and forty cases of eggs. More than that, the crews of the aircraft purchase many things in the local stores including clothing and household supplies for their families back at the base. Officers and men from the station spend regular leaves in Summerside and American uniforms are just as common on the streets as those of the R.C.A.F. Goose Bay is a larger base than Harmon and this valuable trade would be more than doubled if they could be persuaded to inaugurate a regular service. On their trip this week they took 180 gallons of milk in bulk and 360 quarts in paper containers, also 35 cases of eggs as well as other supplies.

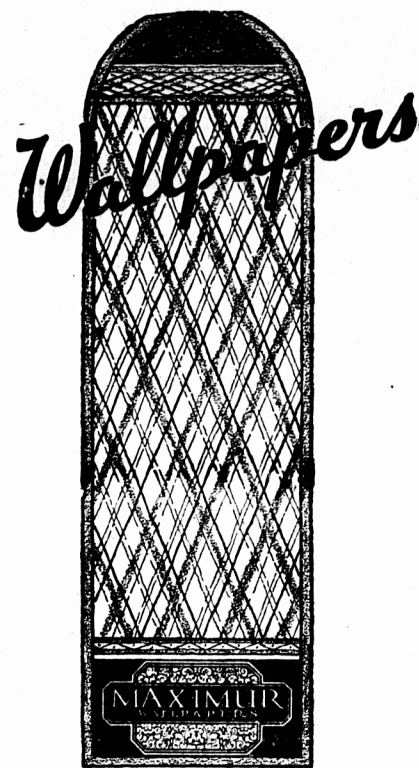
