SHIPPING SEASON STARTED - The shipping season has commenced. On Monday the "General Burstall" arrived at the Montague port to take on a cargo of potatoes, turnips and other produce. The ship is under the command of Captain Levi Harley, who indicated that the produce was destined for Fortune Bay Ports in Newfoundland. Capt. Harley reported that the crossing from Newfoundland had been made without encountering ice. He said he was hopeful of a reciprocal trade developing between the two Islands and Provinces which would be of mutual benefit, inasmuch as Newfoundland possessed certain commodities which could be used extensively here. He was hoping that the Government would dredge out the Montague River this year so that larger ships would be able to come here for loading. He said that it had been his brother's vessel which had had to be towed out the river last fall since there was not sufficient water to take the ship through. He hoped that soon such a condition would be removed. He mentioned further that several other boats were planning on arriving here in the future.
