Stock Markets At A Glance

WINNIPEG, June 7 (CP)—Rye futures prices on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange today rallied from early losses for maximum gains of five cents. In early trading declines of as much as five cents were recorded on reports of rain in the west. Later, offerings dried up and buying came into the market.

CHICAGO, June 7 (AP)—A strong buying move sent rye futures up as much as 3 1/2 cents at times today as inflationary psychology dominated trading. At one time all contracts of all grains recorded on reports of price administration ceilings. July and September corn advanced five cents and small trade developed at that level. Activity in oats was brisk.

NEW YORK, June 7 (AP)—The stock market steadied selectively today after five successive sessions of irregular lower trends. The Associated Press 80-stock market average was up 1 of a point at 81.1, first advance since May 29. Except for Canadian Pacific's gain of 1-4, Canadian stocks and Distillers Seagram were down 1-8. McIntyre 1-4 and Hiram slipped 1-2.
