LONDON, Sept. 1.—(CP)—A death trap closed by the Red Army's encircling drive to the Azov Sea shore west of Taganrog cost Hitler more than 35,000 men in killed alone, with 5,100 others captured, the Russians announced tonight in a communique disclosing steady new gains through four key salients along a 600-mile battle line.

Pacific Raid Alarms Tokyo

WASHINGTON, Sept. 1.—(AP)—In a direct threat to the security of the Japanese homeland, a powerful task force of the United States Navy has bombed and shelled Marcus Island, outpost guarding the approaches to Tokyo.

Says Canada Must Do Part After Victory

QUEBEC, Sept. 1.—(CP)—Finance Minister Halsey said today that Canada must be prepared after victory to do its share in bringing about an international arrangement in developing trade between countries, "possibly even in helping other countries develop themselves to the point where they can trade effectively with us and with others."

ALLIED HEADQUARTERS Southwest Pacific, Sept. 1.—(AP)—Japanese air force units in New Guinea have been forced by Allied raids to fall back 200 miles to bases 500 miles from the Salamaua airbase in northeastern New Guinea.
