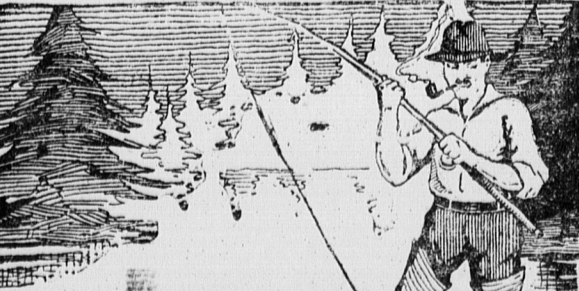

DUKE OF DEVONSHIRE SAILS

LONDON, May 2.—The Duke of Devonshire had a cordial send-off at London and Liverpool yesterday on the occasion of his returning to Canada.

THREE KILLED AND HUNDRED ARRESTED

PARIS, May 2.—Official figures issued today gave the casualties resulting from the strike disorders yesterday as three dead and ten wounded, of whom six remain in hospitals; two of them in a dangerous condition.

The arrested aggregated 103. The foreigners among those arrested are to be deported. Alexander Blanc, extreme Socialist Deputy who was injured in yesterday's clash with the police will be prosecuted on a charge of abuse of the police.

Parliamentary immunity, it is stated, will not apply to his case, which it is asserted was a flagrant offence. M. Blanc was one of the deputies who met the Germans in Switzerland during the war at an international Socialist conference.

The strike of the railroad men has internationalized the railways, which is to be joined tomorrow by the miners and dockmen, has resulted thus far in hindering traffic only on four of the five big systems—the Eastern, Northern and the Paris, Lyons and Mediterranean. Temporarily, however, the State Line which runs to Harve is tied up.

"The strike is a complete failure," said Yves Le Troquer, the Minister of Public Works today.

The Government's determination to fight the strike for nationalization has been voiced by M. Le Troquer and Premier Millerand. M. Millerand said the Government was prepared to do its duty in the maintenance of order and to protect the men who remain at work. M. De Troquer expressed confidence in the outcome of the situation. He explained that he had foreseen the conflict, and that as a result, the railways, public services and industries had been provided with greater supplies of coal than they had at any time since the signing of the armistice.

In carrying out its policy the Government has again issued a decree to requisition more transportation equipment in certain regions. The response of miners to the strike order is awaited with interest, especially as they have been granted their recent demands. The secretary of the Miners' Union in one district has asked the miners not to obey strike calls.

May Day Was Quiet in Italy

ROME, May 3.—Reports from throughout the kingdom today show that May Day passed quietly. Demonstrations were the most orderly in years. The only violence reported was in Turin when the demonstrators threw bombs at the Royal Guards who opened fire precipitating a riot.

Czar Murdered For His Shirt

PARIS, May 3.—The man who confessed to having murdered Czar Nicholas, Boschnitzky by name was executed at Varsovie yesterday. Before being led to the scaffold he begged that his last request in life be granted that he be allowed to wear the silk shirt which Nicholas wore when he riddled him with bullets. It was granted. Those who have spoken at length with the murderer believe he slew the Czar mainly because he wanted the shirt.

Turkey Wants Loan from England

CONSTANTINOPLE, May 3.—Damade Ferid Pasha, Grand Vizier, announced that he is negotiating with the British for a loan on railway construction through the Hedjaz territory toward Mecca. The loan of a million will be used to pay the debt and defray expenses of the campaign against Mustafa Kemal Pasha, the nationalist leader.

Produce Prices Fall in N. B.

FREDERICTON, May 3.—The most startling event of the 1920, May Day in Fredericton has been the general reduction of prices for farm products. In the country markets eggs dropped to 40 cents a dozen, butter sold at 50 cents a pound, 18 cents per pound was the general price for wheat and there were other similar reductions. The supply being so much in excess of the demand that the market lasted much longer than usual in spite of the price cutting.

HEADACHES COME FROM NOSE

That headaches are often due to troubles in the nose is well brought out by Dr. William Wilson in the London Practitioner. They are caused by the closure of the mouths of the ducts that drain the sinuses or cavities in the bones of the head. These sinuses are situated in the upper jaw bones directly under the eyes, in the frontal bones, over and between the eyes, in the thmoid and sphenoid bones, back of the nose and almost in the centre of the head.

The sinuses are lined with mucous membrane and normally are full of air which is changed as we breathe. But a cold in the head causes swelling of the mucous membrane of the nose and pharynx, and the openings of the ducts are then by closed. Then the air in the sinuses is absorbed and a vacuum is produced. Sometimes the inflammation spreads to the lining of the sinuses and they discharge semipure mucus into the nose and throat. If they be blocked they cannot discharge freely.

The result of either of these conditions is headache. Such a headache is generally felt in the morning and passes away as the day wears on.

The cure for these conditions is the freeing of the entrance to the sinus, which is easily done through the nose by a specialist with a bougie inserted through a silver tube. The physician generally touches them with a weak solution of nitrate of silver. Occasionally a slight operation is necessary.
