ISLAND MAN MAKES A BRAVE RESCUE

WINTHROP, Dec. 20.—Patrolman Benjamin Howatt, a veteran member of the Winthrop Police Department was warmly commended at roll call today by Chief of Police William A. McNeill for his bravery last night, when he plunged into Lewis Lake and dragged William Patterson, 11 years old of 14 Willow St., to safety.

Officer Howatt was off duty and about to sit down to supper when he received a telephone call that a boy was drowning in the lake. Throwing on his sweater and overcoat the officer sprang fully clothed to the lake, arriving in time to see the boy disappear beneath the surface.

Removing his outer clothing, Howatt walked on the breaking ice, lived into the cold water and grasped young Patterson as he was about to sink again. A 20 foot plank over which the boy's companion, Edward Gardner had crawled in a vain attempt to reach the Patterson boy, was pushed out to the officer. Catching hold of it he and the boy were dragged ashore. After several minutes of artificial respiration patrolman Howatt and Lieut. James H. Douglas partially revived Patterson.

The boy's desire to tread on the ice was the cause of the accident.

Two sisters, Miss Lizzie Hamro 18, and Mrs. M. F. Shattery, 21 both of 55 River Road made a brave attempt to rescue the boy

but were unsuccessful. The Mr. Howatt referred to in the above, was a former resident of Cape Traverse. He went to Winthrop, Mass., about thirty five years ago. About three years ago he visited his sisters, Mrs. Edward McPherson, Cape Traverse, and Mrs. Nathaniel Pearson, Charlottetown, also his brother William J. on his homestead.
