The action of the provincial government in reference to the telegraph and telephone companies was favorably commented on by several of the members and the following resolution, which was moved by Captain Joseph J. and seconded by Coun. Lidston, was unanimously adopted: Resolved that this Board commend the action taken by the local government in refusing to certify to the service of the Telegraph Company which is unsatisfactory, and asking the Dominion Government to withhold the subsidy until the province is furnished with a service as good in every respect as is enjoyed by the sister provinces of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, and also calling for a second cable. Further resolved that the Board also commend the action of the government in moving in the matter of the unsatisfactory telephone service as well, which is not in accordance with the terms of the company's charter. The winter steam service here was also discussed and a committee was appointed to look after the matter and to look after freight rates. The matter of freight accommodation on the Black Diamond boats was also taken up and the work of Mr. Nicholson, M.P., in this connection was commended.


