By-Laws Amended

Third reading was given to a bill to amend a by-law respecting meat and food products passed second reading, with Coun. Doull in the chair. It prohibits the sale, except by licensed vendors or in the city market, of uncooked meats, poultry and fresh fish. The intention, it was explained, was not to prosecute farm women from selling a few poultry, but to prevent extensive peddling of unspiced fish and meats.

Campaign To Discredit RCMP In Nova Scotia

HALIFAX, Oct. 13—Prosecution of Inspector James P. Blakeney on a charge of having incited two men to hold up the Royal Bank at Shubenacadie is viewed by the Nova Scotia Department of Justice as "part of a most unfair propaganda which is being used for the purpose of discrediting the Royal Canadian Mounted Police."

GOSSIP

NEW YORK, Oct. 13—Seeking to explain the sharp decline on the Stock Exchange yesterday, Wall Street fell back upon the theory that speculative operators had been for two months expecting too much in the way of autumn recovery in trade and business. Even the tonnage statement of the United States incorporated in the shipping news of a 15,000 ton increase as compared with the end of August, was disappointing because the over-enthusiasm of forecasters had put the figure much higher. This same weakness for extravagant guesses has been exhibited in other departments, but the fact, the financial community has come around to the notion that it would have been better for all concerned if six or eight weeks ago had not been indulged in. The slow recovery continues, but the fact that it has not been as rapid as expected seems to have had a disheartening effect.
