## Livestock

MONTREAL, Sept. 29 —(CP)— Prices were steady to higher on the Montreal livestock markets today. Receipts were: cattle 1,835; calves 2,275; sheep 3,396; and hogs 1,334. Cattle sales were fairly active at prices that were steady to unevenly lower. There were no top steers. Good steers sold from \$8.75 to \$9.25 or better, medium were \$7.25 to \$8.50, and common from \$5 to \$7.40 sales up to \$7.25, medium were lower at \$5.25 to \$6.25, and common butchers from \$4.50 to \$5.50. Canners and cutters were \$3 to \$4.25. The few bulls sold made \$4.50 to \$5.25 for common. Good bulls were not weighed at time of writing.

Grass calves were 25 to 50 cents higher. Veals were firm. Veal calves ranged from \$9 to \$13. Good quality made \$12.50 up. Medium kinds \$11 to \$12 and commoner kinds mostly \$9.50 to \$10.50. Drinkers were \$7 to \$8.50. Grassers made the bulk of the offerings selling from \$5.50 to \$8.50 mostly \$6 \$9.25. Heavy calves were slow sellers.

Lambs were fully 50 cents higher than last Monday. Good ewes and wethers brought \$11. Buck lambs and culs were discounted \$2 per hundredweight. Sheep were from \$4 to \$6.50, mostly \$5.50 to \$6.

Hogs were moving slowly at about steady prices. The few early sales made, were at \$14.75 to \$14.85 for B-1 dressed, and \$11.10 to \$11.25 for B-1 all've fed and watered, and up to \$11.25 off trucks delivered. Grade A drew \$1 per hog premium with discounts on off grades. Sows were \$8.50 to \$10 live weight.

MONTREAL, Sept. 29 —(CP)— General increases up to a point were registered by favorites in transportation, industrials and papers today on the stock exchange. Utilities and mines were mixed with gains on top.

The Canada Steamship issues were stronger spots in carriers and rails with a point advance each and O. P. R. picked up a fraction improvement. Harder in industrials were Dominion Coal Preferred and Dosco "up" on the strength of the calling off of the "slow-down" at the Cape Breton collieries. Others out in front were Hamilton Bridge, General Steel Wares and Massey Harris. Asbestos leaned back.

CHICAGO, Sept. 29 —(AP)— Continuing the creeping rally of the past week or so, wheat prices today chalked up new gains of a cent a bushel, reaching the highest level in more than two weeks and coming within about two cents of the four-year peaks established on Sept. 12.

Profit taking and hedging reduced maximum gains but wheat closed 1-2-3-4 higher than yesterday, Dec. 122 7-8-123, May 137 1-4-1-8. Corn was 1-8 off to 1-8 up, Dec. 82 —1-2 up; Rye 1-1-1-4 higher and soybeans 1 1-4-1 3-4 higher.
