Armistice Extended To January 17

COPENHAGEN, Dec. 15.—The German armistice has been extended until five o'clock of the morning of January 17, according to a despatch from Treves where the delegates of the various countries have been in conference.

BIRMINGHAM, Dec. 13.—While expressing his earnest desire to see a league of nations established, J. Austin Chamberlaine, member of the Cabinet, in an address here last night informed his hearers of the difficulty of the task set the nations of the earth.

Praises Work of Canadians In North Russia

OTTAWA, Dec. 10.—The militia department has received from the chief of the imperial general staff at the war office a telegram from Major-General W. E. Ironside commending the Allied forces in Archangel in commendation of the work of the 16th brigade comprising the 67th and 68th batteries, Canadian Field Artillery, in the recent fighting.

"The highest traditions of their army and of Canada in several trying actions have been maintained by field artillery with northern Russian expeditionary force.

"As an old Canadian officer and as commander-in-chief, I wish to place their conduct on record, and would be obliged if the chief of the imperial general staff would convey to the corps commander and to General Morrison his pleasure at having such men under his command."

The Canadian artillery force numbers about 600 of all ranks.

DUBLIN, Dec. 14.—The collapse of Germany is expected in some quarters in Ireland to exert a strong influence on the election of members of Parliament which takes place today.

Pershing's Splendid Tribute to Britain

NEW YORK, Dec. 15.—Gen. Pershing paid the following tribute to Great Britain in a cablegram received here:

"Steadfast in adversity, wounded with a thousand wounds, Great Britain's hammer blows have never weakened nor faltered. But for the tenacity of her people the war would have been lost. To those of us who have been associated with them and fought with their gallant troops, words of praise seem inadequate to express our admiration.

"We offer our right hand of friendship that our two Nations may be more firmly linked together to insure the future of the world."

UNFAIR TO RETURNED SOLDIERS

OTTAWA, Dec. 14.—Reports from certain parts of the Dominion indicate that in some cases when returned soldiers drawing pensions from the government apply for employment, it is suggested that because of their pensions they can afford to take less remuneration than others.

Returned men, says an official memorandum issued today, naturally demand the right to be treated on the same ground as others. When they went away to war they were generally assured that in the matter of employment, they would be well looked after when they returned.

DUTCH PREMIER DECLARES FOR KAISER'S RIGHT OF SANCTUARY

AMSTERDAM, Dec. 14.—The Premier of Holland, Jonkheer Ruijs De Beerenbrouck, who yesterday declared in the lower house that there could be no question of internment in the case of the former German emperor nor could there be a demand for his return to Germany because of the right of sanctuary, is quoted in a despatch received from The Hague today as also saying: It is possible that foreign governments might desire to consult with Holland regarding a new place of residence for the Kaiser.

"The present arrangement is provisional, he explained. The government is reserving its definite decision."

PRESIDENT WILSON MODIFIES HIS VIEWS

LONDON, Dec. 14.—As a result of informal conversations regarding President Wilson's freedom of the seas proposals, the British Government is now in possession of concrete suggestions which are more understandable than the "free seas" clause in Mr. Wilson's "fourteen points," according to the Express.

President Wilson, the newspaper says, has information showing definitely that Great Britain cannot surrender the right of search, the contraband law and the right to enforce blockade.

It is understood that Mr. Wilson's proposals do not include the abandonment of any of these rights and that they are generally in no wise antagonistic to their interests, as has been supposed.
