DIAZ READY TO ASSIST MEXICO

PARIS, June 14 (Special)—General Porfirio Diaz recently received a delegation of Mexican friends who had come to request him to return to Mexico in order to assist by his counsel in the restoration of tranquility to that country.

His reply is said to have been:—"I should be pleased to return and reside in my country, but I am determined not to participate in its politics."

A brother-in-law of General Diaz left for Mexico today to discuss with the Government there the question of the return of the dictator.

CHURCH UNION.

TORONTO, June 10—After a strenuous afternoon session spent in the discussion of church union, the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Canada spent a quiet evening discussing the Sabbath School and Young People's Society work.

The Rev. Dr. C. A. Myers, of Edmonton was appointed assistant to the Rev. Dr. J. C. Robertson, secretary of the Sabbath School and Young People's Societies' board.

Dr. Myers will take charge of the work in Western Canada, and will probably make his headquarters in Edmonton.

Mr. Walter Ball, of Montreal, opened the discussion on church union. He said he was not opposed to church union when the time came for its consummation, but he did not believe that the time had come.

"I want to ask this audience," said Mr. Ball, "after the discussion of finance we have had, what do you think of union? Is union going to help you carry out this programme?"

Mr. David Christie, of Winnipeg, said that the forces of evil were organized all round. If they were going to be fought they would have to present a united front to them.

Dr. Gunn, of Toronto, said he wished to dissociate in the most emphatic manner with those who impugned the motive of those opposed to union. The question, he said, was a religious question, and not merely an ecclesiastical question.

"We go out into the world," said the speaker, "and the question comes, 'Are we willing to enter' into co-operation with those of the other denominations?"

The Rev. Dr. Campbell made an able contribution to the discussion.

"It was indeed surprising," he said, "that so many ministers and elders voted in favor of the substitution of the doctrinal part of the basis of union for the confession of faith, so there is wanting in it the visible Pauline doctrine of predestination; there is in it no reference to the covenant made with Adam, and that particular election and particular redemption."

SPAIN'S PREMIER AGAIN RESIGNS

MADRID, June 04 (Special)—Because the vote in the Spanish Senate revealed a split in the Liberal party, Comar, again handed to King Alfonso his resignation and that of his Ministry. The resignations were accepted provisionally.

are not embraced in it. There is an absence of the outstanding truth of effectual calling and its doctrinal corollary of perseverance which have so largely entered into the domestic instruction of Presbyterians for centuries which were calculated to confer spiritual dignity upon those accepting them, and which it may be historically claimed imparted fibre to Presbyterianism and begot in them a deep sense of moral responsibility.

"The high doctrine of 'free will and fate,'" which Scottish artisans have been wont to discuss when they met at the street corners had not a little to do with shaping Scottish life and character. The "basis" does not give that prominence to the sovereignty of God."

Principal Murray, of Saskatoon, went into the statistics of the vote which had been taken upon church union, and in comparison between the vote cast at the last general election of the Dominion, contended that the vote taken by the Church was much more reliable as showing the attitude of the Church than the conservative vote reflected the opinion of Canada at that election. The opportunity presented the Church to-day was such as had never been presented before in consummating union.

The debate is being continued to-day.
