Livestock MONTREAL, Dec. 20 —(CP)— Receipts on Montreal livestock markets today were 100 cattle, 144 calves, 846 hogs and 150 sheep and lambs. One load of choice heavy steers made \$7. Plain cows and bulls were on keen demand. Veal calves were stronger. Common cows sold at \$3 to \$3.25 with mediums \$3.25 to \$3.75. Common bulls were \$3 to \$3.75 with fleshy butcher bulls around \$4. Veal calves were strong at \$8 to \$10.50. Good veals making \$10.50 with medium kinds from \$9.50 to \$10. Drinkers were \$4.50 to \$7 and grassers \$3.50 to \$4. When graded, good ewes and weathers made \$9, heavies \$8 culls and bucks \$7. A few lws were sold on a flat basis at \$7.25. Sheep Bacon hogs were \$9.25 fed and watered, and \$9.50 off trucks. Selects drew \$1 per hog premium with medium grades on off grades. Sows were from \$7 to \$8. Hogs sold on rail grade brought \$12.70 cold weight. MONTREAL, Dec. 20 —(CP)— The Department of Agriculture today noted livestock prices as follows: Rail grade hogs advanced 40 cents to \$11.70 hot weight; sows remained steady at \$7.60. Live grade hogs advanced 25 cents to \$8.65 off trucks; sows were steady at \$5.50. MONTREAL, Dec. 20 —(CP)— Despite inactive trading, butter prices held steady on open prod- uce markets here today. The Dominion Department of Agriculture reported. Other products remained unchanged, barring a few variations on the egg section. Creamery butter prints to re- tailers were 22 1/2-23 1/2 and solids 22-22 1/2. Western butter delivered in Montreal was offered at 21 3/4 for regraded. Que. No. 1 pasteurized butter in wholesale jobbing lots was 21 1/2 for regrad- ed. Ont. white cheese sold for 11 3/8-12 cents a pound and colored for 11 1/2. Graded egg shipments in used free cases were offered at 35 cents a dozen for A-large, 29 for A-medium, 28 for A-pullies, 24-25 for B-large and 21 1/2 for C. Potatoes: Que. No. 2 80's 75-85; N. B. NEW YORK, Dec. 20 —(AP)— The British Pound dropped 1 1/2 cents to close at 4.66 1/4 today in terms of the United States dol- lar. The decline came in the face of a declaration by the British Chancellor of the Exchequer that full restrictions—relaxed earlier in the year—would be again ap- plied to foreign loans. The French franc lost .00 1/4 cent to 2.63 1/4 and the Swiss franc dipped .08 cent. The guild- er was unchanged while the belga gained 0.1-2 cent. The Canad- ian dollar lost 1-16 cent to a one per cent discount.

TORONTO, Dec. 20 —(CP)— The stock market appeared to be suffering today from the Christ- mas shopping rush. Buying orders dwindled and offerings were ac- cepted only at price reductions. All indices declined the indus- trial leading with a loss of 1.41. Western oils tumbled .06 in the index while base metals were down .63 and the golds .55. Vol- ume was 310,000 shares under that of Monday with a turnover of 627, 000 shares. Brokers of the junior golds was about the only competition for the western oils holding the spotlight. Broutan traded 147,000 shares and advanced 8 cents. Other penny issues moving in considerable volume and better prices included Bobjo, Madsen and Augite. Dome, Lake Shore and Mc- Intyre declined 1-2 to a point, MacLeod-Cockshutt dropped 12 cents to 2.68 and loser of 5 to 10 cents were boarded by Cariboo, Macassa, Northern Empire, O'Brien, Pioneer, Powell-Rouyn, Uchi-Sylvanite and Tob rn. Pick- le Crow firmed 10 cents.

WINNIPEG, Dec. 20 —(CP)— Wheat futures prices moved nar- rowly in dull trading on Win- nipeg exchange today showing an easier tone most of the session attributed to hesitation at Chi- cago and prospects of moisture in the United States winter wheat belt. Closing values were 1-4-1-2 cent lower with December at 59 1-8; May 61-61 1-8; and July 61 1-2 cents. With exception of minor offerings and early seaboard de- mand, trading at Winnipeg lagged aggressive support. Information that the United States final estimate of wheat production showed a decline of 10,000,000 from previous forecasts had only small bearing on the market trend. Interest in cash wheat and coarse grains was practically dormant, with sales of all grains confined to a few cars. Offerings were scarce as prices moved with- in a narrow range.
