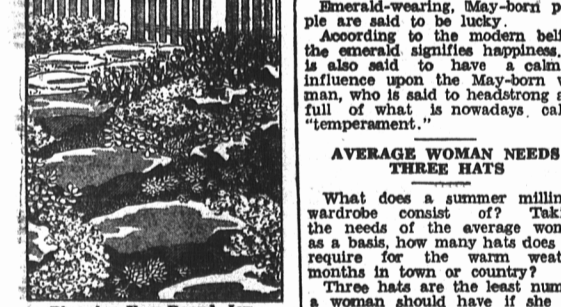

The other day some one asked me whom I considered the wickedest woman in the world, to which I promptly replied, "The child-spoiler—the mother who never disciplines her children, who never teaches them self-control, or obedience, or respect for authority. THE COOK'S CORNER

Butterscotch Slices (First Part)

1 cup flour
3/4 cup brown sugar
1/2 cup butter

Method: Sift the flour and mix the brown sugar with it. Add the butter and crumble these together. Put this mixture into a lightly greased pan and bake in a moderate, 350 deg. F. oven for 15 minutes. Meanwhile prepare the second part.

(Second Part)

2 eggs
2 tablespoons flour
1 cup brown sugar
1-2 teaspoon baking powder
1 cup chopped nuts
1 cup shredded cocoanut
1-2 teaspoon vanilla

Method: Beat the eggs and add the sugar, flour and baking powder mixing these in well. Stir in the shredded cocoanut and the chopped nuts and flavor with a little vanilla, or butterscotch.

Remove the pan containing the first part from the oven and pour the second part into it. Return to the oven and continue to bake for about 20 minutes longer, until the top layer is done. Cut in squares and cool on a cake rack.

Chocolate Chip Cookies

1 cup shortening
3-4 cup brown sugar
3-4 cup white sugar
2 eggs, beaten
2 teaspoons vanilla
1 teaspoon soda
2 tablespoons hot water
1-2 cups flour
1 cup chopped nuts
1-2 cup finely cut chocolate

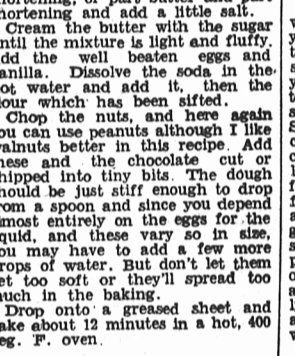
Method: If you are using butter for the shortening you won't need any salt in this recipe and I like butter better than anything else for cookies. But if that sounds too extravagant, then use vegetable shortening, or part butter and part shortening and add a little salt.

Cream the butter with the sugar until the mixture is light and fluffy. Add the well beaten eggs and vanilla. Dissolve the soda in the hot water and add it. Then the flour which has been sifted.

Chop the nuts, and here again you can use peanuts although I like walnuts better in this recipe. Add these and the chocolate cut or chopped into tiny bits. The dough should be just stiff enough to drop from a spoon and since you depend almost entirely on the eggs for the liquid, and these vary so in size, you may have to add a few more drops of water. But don't let them get too soft or they'll spread too much in the baking.

Drop onto a greased sheet and bake about 12 minutes in a hot, 400 deg. F. oven.
