Leafs To Olympia

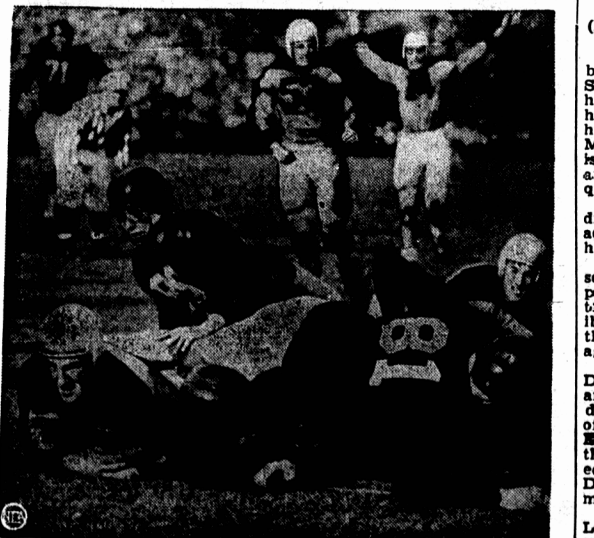
