THE GOVERNMENT AND THE WINTER SERVICE.

By the terms of the union compact, by the interprovincial nature of the service, by the fact that the Government owns and operates the Minto and the Stanley and orders them whether it will, the Government is responsible for the steamer service between the Island and the mainland. By the confession of the Government publicly made and attested by the payment of a million dollars forfeit, that service has been and is utterly inadequate. By the promise of another steamer made by successive Ministers of Marine, (Messrs. Prefontaine and Brodeur) a promise made and broken, the Government stands convicted of a gross breach of faith toward this Province. By sending the two steamers to Georgetown and keeping them there when the port of Charlottetown is and has been open to navigation, the Government has added indignity and extortion to the other heavy grievances above recited.

Why our importers, our merchants and shippers of produce should be needlessly penalized twenty dollars per car load, except to add exasperation to injury it would be difficult to conjecture. The Government extorts the money and it goes into the treasury. The Government must answer. It chooses to leave to Captain Brown full discretion as to when he shall leave the port of Summerside and to Captain Finlayson a like discretion as to his coming and going to and from Charlottetown. Captain Brown thinks Summerside a good port to get away from as speedily as possible. Captain Finlayson indulges his juvenile timidity as to coming hither even in open water. Both prefer to make pleasure excursions to Georgetown. What is it to them that freight is delayed, produce frozen and destroyed, and trade taxed in tens of thousands! The Government is responsible.

Never was the word of promise so broken both to the ear and to the hope as has been the compact between Canada and Prince Edward Island. Shall Canada be permitted to break that compact in the most exasperating way and the Island remain bound by the compact! There is no law divine or human which can be so construed! The compact is broken; it is not we that have broken it. To the last jot and tittle of the terms of union, Prince Edward Island has fulfilled every obligation of that agreement. Let our enemies be the judges and they cannot decide otherwise. We have kept faith; Canada has broken faith with us, is daily breaking faith with us, and adding indignity to injury. These words will be read in thousands of Island homes and every man who reads must endorse the indictment as a true bill.

What then shall we do? What does it become us to do as self-respecting freemen? The time has come when we must calmly consider this question. The bond of union of which we have kept a strict observance, has become oppressive, odious to us. Shall we assert our freedom? The way is open for our oppressors have opened the gate. Shall we go on paying tribute, tending the knee, and submitting to masters who have forfeited their authority? Shall we go on, paying tribute under conditions where it can no longer be collected; under a policy of misrule and oppression which has crippled our every industry, shranked our trade, cut off one third of our representation in Parliament and driven tens of thousands of our sons and daughters into exile? We cannot go on thus. Self-preservation, the first and the last law of nature, forbids it. Self respect forbids; manhood forbids. What then?

Judging from letters, we have received and some that have been printed elsewhere we infer that the proposal to hand over the steam service between the Island and Mainland in the winter to a company meets with but little acceptance. There is much more evidence of favor for government control and management throughout the year. The Government must be held to its responsible bill.

When the Anglo-American Telegraph cable at the Capes was broken and communication interrupted some years ago the Guardian strongly presented the great risk of going on with only one old cable for dependence, and urged the laying down of a second cable. The present break has demonstrated the prudence of that recommendation. The present interruption is greatly to be regretted, the more so as it will be of indefinite duration. What is the Government doing to supply the loss? Why is not the Marconi service turned to account? Under the terms of union the Government is as much responsible for continuous telegraph communication as for the steamer service. But the Ottawa heavens are as brass to the needs and prayers of Prince Edward Island.
