WORLD'S TEMPERANCE LESSON.

Matt. 24: 32-44.

GOLDEN TEXT.

"Watch and pray lest ye enter into temptation."—Matt. 26: 41.

POINTED SUGGESTIONS.

Because there are some things in this lesson which are hard to be understood and still more difficult to explain, there is no need to miss the consideration of the tremendous and thrillingly important application of it all, namely, "Therefore be ye also ready."

The study of the limitations of Jesus or of the mystery of the dwelling together in one person in the flesh of perfect God and perfect man, the attempt to reconcile the text of Matthew with the facts of history or the adjustment of it to suit the conditions which the fall of Jerusalem and the second coming of Christ present may prove satisfactory to that sort of folks to whom it may prove satisfactory; but such discussion will be fruitless as a world's temperance lesson.

The fact remains that there are those who, in their unbelief and hardness of heart, will riot in sin upon the verge, upon the very brink and border of the unknown world, where judgment shall meet them and where destiny is fixed.

There is nothing which more surely blinds the moral and spiritual sensibilities to everything which the reason or the affections suggest as wise or worthy than the drink habit, unless it is that blackest form of covetousness which fattens and fattens upon it through the manufacture and sale of intoxicating liquors.

Of course, there are other sins besides those of drunkenness and the liquor traffic which will be the reason why fellow-workers and members of families shall be separated when the Son of Man cometh. Let him that thinketh he standeth take heed. But one thing is sure, and that is this, the liquor traffic nor any of its products, results or fruits can abide God's judgment day. They shall go quickly down to hell.
