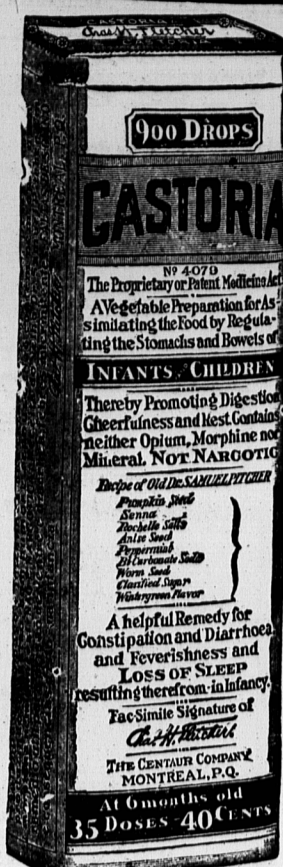

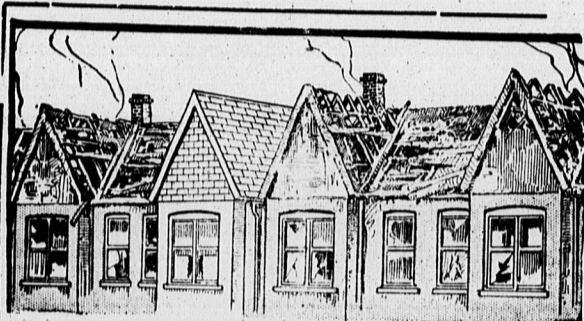

Three Destroyed One Roof Escaped

The picture tells the story. Mr. Offer's letter confirms the fire-resistant qualities of

Close Vienna Bourse To Stop Speculation

VIENNA, Sept. 22.—Acting at the instance of Socialists, the police today occupied the Bourse and stopped all trading. This was among today's developments following a conference last night between Otto Bauer, Social Democratic leader and Chancellor Schoner, when the chancellor agreed to the re-entry of Socialists into the Government and the immediate enactment of their radical plans of finance reform as the only chance to avert a collapse of the country.

The announcement that the Government had conceded the demands of the civil servants for increases in pay in September amounting to nine billion crowns, coupled with a false report from Zurich that the crown was increasing in value instead of falling sharply, resulted in the closing of the Bourse, which the Socialists demanded as the first step of good faith to prevent the unchecked panic and speculation in exchange.

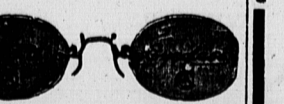
