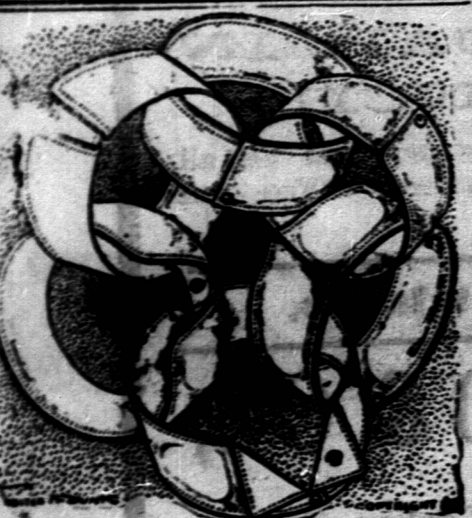

**NEW FEVER SERUM.**

MONTREAL, November 6.—Dr. G. A. Charlton, Rockefeller fellow of pathology at McGill, has just concluded the treatment of fifteen cases of scarlet fever with a new serum. Under the ordinary treatment a large proportion would have ended fatally, or been accompanied by troublesome complications. Thirteen made prompt recoveries, almost free from complications. Two died, one a few hours after admission to the hospital, and the other from diphtheria.

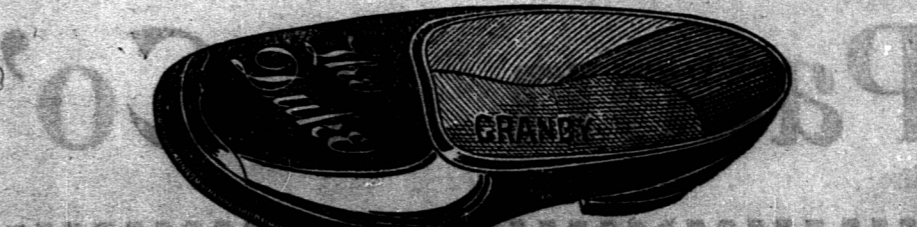
