M. PELLETAN SEES "HOLY WAR" FOR FRANCE AGAINST ENGLAND

BIZERTA, Tanis, Sept. 16.—M. Pelletan, the French Minister of Marine, made a remarkable speech at an entertainment of that municipality yesterday evening which it is said will give the French Foreign Minister, M. Delcasse, some trouble to explain.

"We do not know what others are doing, it is part of our duty to prepare for the holy war, for the French fatherland against its enemies whoever they may be. I am convinced, thanks to the fellow-workers with whom I am surrounded, that we can face every eventuality. Security hardly exists any more for the civilized world.

JUDGE MORRISON ON NEWFOUNDLAND AFFAIRS

Confederation Will be a Live Issue in the Next Election—Very Little Interest in Sir Robert Bond's Washington Mission.

SYDNEY, September 16.—Donald Morrison, of St. John's Nfld., ex-Judge of the supreme court of Newfoundland, was in Sydney today on his way to Boston. Interviewed by The Herald correspondent he gave his impressions of the situation in the ancient colony.

"Very little interest is being taken in the mission of Sir Robert Bond to Washington. At the present time we are giving all Americans, under the modus vivendi all that the terms of the Bond-Blaine treaty would give them. For a license fee of \$150 per ton American vessels are permitted to buy bait, etc., in our waters.

MINUTES OF PRESBYTERY.

At Charlottetown, and within St. James' Hall there, on Tuesday, September 19th, and at 11 a. m. which place and date the Presbytery of Prince Edward Island met and was constituted: Mr. W. H. Spencer, Moderator protempore with whom were present Messrs. A. McLean Sinclair, R. McLean, Gillis, Fullerton, McLeod, Miller, Craise and McDonald, ministers, and Messrs James and Nicholson, elders.

Presbytery took up the resignation of Mr. D. J. McDonald. On motion the resignation was accepted to take effect from this date. Mr. A. W. K. Herdman was appointed Interim Moderator. Mr. H. Hardie was appointed to supply Murray Harbor North on Sabbaths Sept. 21st and 28th with instructions to declare the pulpit vacant on the first mentioned date.

Mr. A. C. also reported that on the 15th inst he had moderated in a call at Bay Fortune, which came out unanimously and enthusiastically in favor of Mr. F. C. Simpson.

That on the evening of the same day he had moderated at Souris, when again the call was unanimous and enthusiastic in favor of Mr. Simpson.

The action of Mr. Craise was sustained and the Commissioners Mr. Webster, from Bay Fortune, and Mr. Jardine from Souris, were heard. They both testified to the heartiness and unanimity of the call, and explained that owing to the short time at their disposal they had not been able to go over the entire congregation to secure signatures.

The question of a grant for Souris was further adjourned to be discussed during the Synod. The clerk read a paper from certain persons belonging to the Dundas section of the Dundas and Annandale congregation and there being two delegates present, Messrs McDonald and McKay, representing the petitioners these were heard ex gratia.

After careful consideration of the whole question the Presbytery saw no reason to change the action taken at the last meeting but appointed the following Committee to visit the field and ascertain how matters stand, and report to Presbytery: A. McLean Sinclair, Convener, R. McLean and J. W. MacKenzie.

The clerk read the report of the Presbytery of the W. F. M. S. On motion the Presbytery received the report and expressed deep gratification at its favorable showing, with the prayer that the labours of this valuable society may be abundantly blessed.

Mr. Fullerton reported that a call was in progress in Strathalbyn congregation which he trusted would be ready for Presbytery at its next meeting. Presbytery then adjourned to meet at the call of the clerk of which public intimation was made and this seditant closed with the Benediction.

All sessions who have not appointed representative elders are requested to do so without delay, and send their names to the clerk, so that the Synod roll may be completed.
