Meeting of Presbytery

The quarterly meeting of the Prince Edward Island Presbytery was held yesterday morning in Zion Church Hall, Dr. McEwen, Moderator, in the chair. There were present, Revs. J. C. Martin, J. D. McKenzie, D. McVicar, J. A. Greenlees, J. M. McLeod, T. W. Wilson, J. S. McKay, T. Christie, G. C. Taylor, W. A. McQuarrie, George Millar, John Murchison, John Stirling, R. H. Stavert and Mr. Sweet, Ministers and a number of Elders. Considerable routine business was transacted. Mr. Sydney Bonnell, B. A., was appointed acting minister in the Cavenish congregation for the summer months. Rev. E. Lockhart of Montross accepted a call from the Souris congregation, induction to take place on Thursday 20th inst. at 7.30 p.m., Rev. J. M. McLeod to preside and induct, Rev. J. D. McKenzie to preach. Rev. J. A. Greenlees to address the minister and Rev. J. C. Martin to address the people. Intimation was made that Rev. Mr. McLellan had accepted a call to Valleyfield, induction to take place July 15. A unanimous call from Murray Harbor North to Rev. John Murchison, Malpeque, was laid before the Presbytery, parties being heard. Mr. Murchison was given permission to reserve his decision for one month. A committee consisting of Revs. J. C. OTTAWA, May 10.—(Canadian Press.)—Interest in the budget, which Sir Henry Drayton is expected to bring down on Wednesday, centers around the possibility of a new luxury tax, and the probable extension of the business profits tax to the fiscal year which

has just begun. Some slight revision of the tariff is probable, but the general belief is that there will be few innovations in customs duties on staple commodities. The taxation of incomes may not be increased to any extent. It is expected in some quarters, that revenues from this source will have to be increased, while in others it is suggested that the government will endeavor to shift the burden by means of a luxury tax which will be pretty general in its application, and by revising the business profits tax so as to permit of a continuation of liberal revenues from this source without handicapping essential industries.

There is a dearth of speculation in informed parliamentary circles as to the terms of the 1920 budget. Much of the burden of cost of demobilization has been wiped out in the past fiscal year and faced with extraordinary economic conditions the government is not expected to bring in any radical changes in taxation for the coming year.

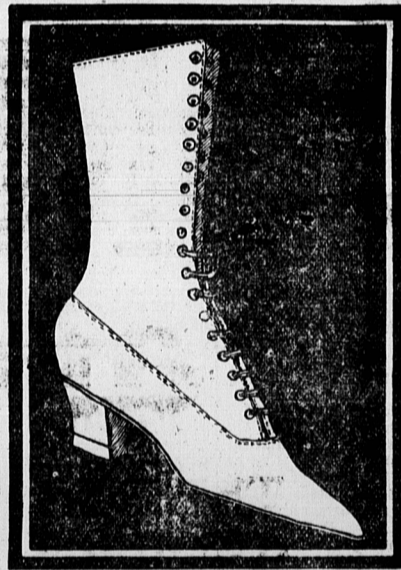

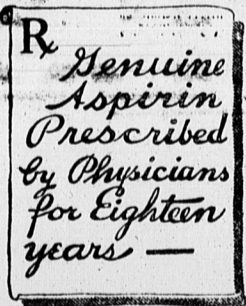
