It is even a vapor, that appeareth for a little time, and then vanisheth away." Hymns sung were: "Rock of Ages", "Gather Ye Together at the River", "The Lord Is My Shepherd", all favourites of the deceased, and as a solo Mr. Charles Woodside sang very feelingly, "Beauty for Ashes". The pallbearers were Augustus MacLellan, Bernard MacLellan, Fred Tuplin, Andrew Tuplin, William Burns, Thomas Campbell. Interment was in Malpeque Cemetery beside her husband who predeceased her 17 years ago.

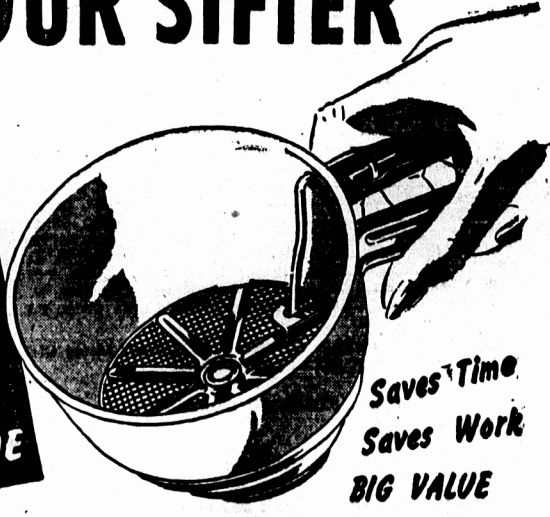
